### Departs: Fridays, Saturdays & Sundays

### Day 1: Cairo

Upon arrival at Cairo airport transfer to the Marriott Hotel for overnight. Built more than a century ago for Napoleon's wife, the Marriott Hotel offers palatial surroundings with every modern luxury. To ensure the highest level of comfort you will be accommodated in the recently renovated rooms.

### Day 2: Cairo-Sightseeing

Today enjoy a full day of sightseeing. First drive to Giza to be astonished by the ancient Pyramids and their

enigmatic guardian, the Sphinx. At the site there is the option to climb inside one of the pyramids to see where the Pharaohs were buried. Enjoy lunch en route before continuing to Memphis, the capital of Egypt during the Old Kingdom. Then to Sakkara, to see the Step Pyramid of Zoser I. Dating back to 2686BC, this is the oldest ancient Egyptian Cemetery. (B, L)

### Day 3: Cairo-Luxor-Cruising

This morning transfer from your hotel to Cairo airport for your flight to Luxor. Upon arrival transfer to the Sonesta Star Goddess cruise vessel. This boat boasts deluxe facilities with the service to match. All suites contain modern features including plasma TV, wireless internet and panoramic windows with private balconies. On board you can make use of the jogging track, infinity swimming pool, gym, sauna and jacuzzi. After lunch on board visit the imposing Karnak Temple with its history spanning thirteen centuries. Then take an unforgettable visit to Luxor Temple. Return to Karnak Temple in the evening for an optional spectacular sound and light

### Day 4: Cruising-Luxor-Esna

This morning cross to the West Bank of the Nile where you will see the huge Colossi of Memnon and Queen Hatshepsut's Temple, which blends in to the Cliffside above. Also visit the Valley of the Kings, where many of the ancient pharaohs were buried. Sail to Esna in the late afternoon and unwind in the evening with a welcome

### Day 5: Cruising-Esna-Edfu-Kom Ombo

After breakfast sail to Edfu to see the Temple of Horus, the falcon headed god. This beautifully preserved temple was buried under sand and silt for nearly two thousand years. Continue on to Kom Ombo for dinner and a Galabeya party on board. (B, L, D)

### Day 6: Cruising-Kom Ombo-Aswan

Morning visit of Kom Ombo including a visit to its Greco-Roman temple overlooking the Nile. Sail to Aswan for lunch and then visit the sites of Aswan, including the High Dam, Granite Quarries and Temple of Philae, which was the centre of the Cult of Isis. In the evening enjoy dinner and a Nubian folkloric show on board. (B, L, D)



### Day 7: Aswan-Abu Simbel-Aswan

Disembark after breakfast and transfer to Aswan airport to commence your tour (by air) to Abu Simbel. Marvel at the breathtaking temples built by Ramses II. The impressive façade is comprised of four colossal statues of the pharaoh on his throne. Return to Aswan and transfer to your Hotel in Aswan. Spend the afternoon at your leisure. We recommend the felucca ride or a walk around legendary hotel Old Cataract, recently renovated it is best known for its mention in Agatha Christie's 'Death on the Nile' book. (B)

### Day 8: Aswan-Cairo

Morning transfer to Aswan airport for your flight to Cairo. Upon arrival in Cairo visit the Egyptian Museum of Antiquities to see a collection of pieces form every period of ancient Egyptian history, including Tutankhamun's life-sized golden mask and his two inner coffins. In the afternoon there is an optional dinner cruise. Overnight at Cairo Marriott Hotel. (B)

### Day 9: Cairo-Sightseeing

Pick up from your hotel for a half day private tour. See the Citadel, home to Egypt's rulers for nearly 700 years. Then pick up some last minute bargains at Cairo's hustling bazaar, the Khan el Khalili. built in 1382, the market is famed for its bustling atmosphere. Afternoon at leisure. (B)

### Day 10: Cairo

Breakfast at your hotel. Transfer to Cairo Airport. (B)

# Footsteps of Tutankhamun

### **Departs:** Saturdays

### Day 1 Sat: Cairo

Arrive in Cairo airport and private luxury transfer to your hotel Marriott Mena House located at the foot of the Pyramids offering one of a kind accommodation experience with unmatched views of the Giza (accommodation in a Deluxe Pyramids View room). After check in enjoy the rest of the day at leisure.

### Day 2 Sun: Cairo

After breakfast visit the necropolis of Sakkara and the impressive museum of Imhotep. Continue to Memphis the see the colossal statue of Ramses II and the great alabaster Sphinx being the second



largest in Egypt. Lunch provided to experience the local cuisine. On to the 4,500-year old Pyramids of Giza, built for Pharaohs Cheops, Chephren and Mycerinus. The Great Pyramid is the oldest of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World still in existence. Just to the east lies the legendary Sphinx. Visit the papyrus factory and learn the history of the papyrus symbolising lower Egypt as well the procedures of preparation and drawing. Return to your hotel for overnight. Tonight join optional Sound and Light show Pyramids. (B, L)

### Day 3 Mon: Cairo-Luxor

Morning transfer to Cairo airport for a short flight to Luxor. On arrival transfer to pier for embarkation on Sonesta St. George luxury Nile Cruise (accommodation in Beethoven suite with private balcony). Enjoy lunch onboard your cruise. In the afternoon an unforgettable excursion to the Luxor Temple, which was built by two great pharaohs Amenhotep III and Ramses II. Travel along an avenue of ram-headed sphinxes, extending for about two miles, which link Luxor Temple with the Karnak Temple. No site in the world makes a more overwhelming and lasting impression than this "Temple of all Temples". On your way back to the port visit the local school

of Fraciscan Sisters and the Orphanage. Return back to the vessel for afternoon tea and dinner onboard. After dinner proceed to the lounge to enjoy belly dance and Egyptian folkloric show. (B, L, D)

### Day 4 Tue: Cruising-Luxor-Esna

After breakfast join a tour to the West Bank including visits to the Valley of the Kings housing many of the tombs of pharaohs from the New Kingdom including access to three tombs. Continue to Queen Hatshepsut's Temple, the only woman pharaoh to reign in ancient Egypt, followed by stop near Colossi of Memnon - two massive stone statues of Pharaoh Amenhotep III rising majestically about 18m also known as the singing statues. Return to your vessel for lunch. Sail to Esna. Enjoy an afternoon tea time on the top deck while swimmingand relaxing cruising along a scenic agricultural landscape by the Nile sores. Enjoy Captain's welcome cocktail and dinner onboard. Overnight in Esna. (B, L, D)

### Day 5 Wed: Cruising-Esna-Edfu-Kom Ombo-Aswan

Cross the Esna Lock to Edfu. Today visit the Temple of Horus at Edfu, having escaped destruction from Nile floods, is the most completely preserved and most atmospheric of ancient Egyptian temples. Return on board the cruise and sail to Kom Ombo. In ancient Egypt the city was important to the caravan routes from Nubia and various gold mines. Lunch onboard and free time to relax. Afternoon tea. Visit the Temple of Kombo dedicated to two gods the local crocodile god Sobek and Haroeris (Horus the older). After finishing the Temple visit continue to the New crocodile museum well worth a visit for its beautiful collection of mummified crocodiles and ancient carvings. Return back onboard for diner. Tonight dress up with Gallabya, a traditional Egyptian garment and join the Gallabya party while Overnight onboard in Kom Ombo. (B, L, D)

### Day 6 Thu: Cruising-Aswan

Sail to Aswan. Today take a motorised boat to the island of Agilika and visit the legendary Philae temple dedicated to the goddess Isis and reflects a fusion of three great civilisations - Egyptian, Greek and Roman. The temple was dismantled, and then painstakingly reassembled when the Aswan High Dam was constructed. Visit the High Dam an engineering miracle when it was built in the 1960s. It contains 18 times the material used in the Great Pyramid of Cheops. Continue to the Northen

Quarries where the large Unfinished Obelisk is located. The site provided valuable insight into how those monuments were created, although the full construction process is still not entirely clear. Return on board the cruise for lunch and in the afternoon sail by traditional felucca boat around Kitchener's island and Agha Khan Mausoleum. Today join a special visit to Sofitel Old cataract hotel where you will enjoy famous afternoon tea. Its captivating atmosphere inspired Agatha Christies' famous work, "Death on the Nile". Return onboard for dinner and enjoy a Nubian party with life music. Overnight in Aswan. (B, L, D) **Day 7 Fri: Aswan-Cairo** 

After breakfast transfer to the airport for your short flight to the Abu Simbel temples of Ramses II and Queen Nefertari at Abu Simbel - moved stone by stone in 1964 to higher ground to escape the rising waters of Lake Nasser. After visiting the temple transfer to the airport for your flight back to Cairo. Here you are met and transferred to the Kempinski Nile -luxury hotel in the city center. Tonight experience a private home hosted dinner with a traditional Egyptian local family, where you'll get a to meet the family members and see how they live, and chat while tasting delicious Egyptian homemade dishes. Return to your hotel for overnight at Kempinski Nile Hotel at Deluxe Nile View room. (B, D)

### Day 8 Sat: Cairo

After breakfast visit the Egyptian Museum of Antiquities, one of the most famous museums in the world. See numerous priceless treasures discovered over the years from many different periods of Egyptian History, including the golden mask of Tutankhamun. Continue to the Citadel and Bazaar. Inside the Citadel you can see the splendid Mosque of Mohamed Ali. Experience the excitement and chaos of the Khan Al Khalili Bazaar, one of the earliest and greatest markets of the Middle East known for its jewellery, leather goods and souvenirs. You can collect a real bargain if you are prepared to haggle! Enjoy traditional lunch at a local restaurant. Return to hotel for overnight. (B, L)





### **Departs:** Daily

### Day 1: Cairo

Be meet at the at Cairo airport representative before being transfer to your hotel. Overnight Cairo.

### Day 2: Cairo-Sightseeing

In the morning you'll be picked up from your hotel for a private tour of the famous Egyptian Museum followed by a short drive to the Giza Plateau. Visit the amazing Pyramids and magnificent Sphinx. (B)

### Day 3: Cairo-Luxor

In the morning transfer to Cairo airport

for your flight to Luxor, a town which stands where ancient Thebes the "City of the Thousand Gates" once stood. Luxor is still considered an open-air museum due to the many monuments still preserved from the time of Ramses the Great. On arrival transfer to your cruise vessel and embark before lunch. In the afternoon visit to the awe-inspiring Temple of Karnak and stand where the great Kings and Queens of Egypt once presided over their people. View the statue of Tutankhamun and his wife at Luxor Temple and the majestic statues of Ramses the Great standing guard over Karnak Temple. (B, L, D)

### Day 4: Cruising-Luxor-Esna-Edfu

After breakfast cross to the West Bank and visit the Necropolis of Thebes where the Valley of the Kings now rests. View what was once the resting place for many kings. Continue onto the temple of Queen Hatshepsut, who was in her own right a Pharaoh of Egypt, before viewing the ancient statues of the Colossi of Memnon. Board the cruise vessel and sail to Esna and cross the Lock before arriving at Edfu for an overnight stay. (B, L, D)

### Day 5: Cruising-Edfu-Kom Ombo-Aswan

This morning visit the temple of Horus. Continue to Kom Ombo. Its temple has a double sanctuary and is dedicated to two divinities Haroeris (Horus the Elder), and Sobek, the Crocodile - God. Continue onto Aswan. (B, L, D)

### Day 6: Cruising-Aswan

After breakfast visit the High Dam and the Temple of Philae. Afternoon sail by traditional felucca boat around Elephantine Island and Agha Khan Mausoleum. Overnight on board. (B, L, D)



### Day 6: Cruising-Edfu-Esna-Luxor

Breakfast on board. Visit the Temple of Horus, considered by most to be the best preserved cult temple in Egypt. According to Egyptian myths it was the place where the falcon-headed god Horus avenged the murder of his father Osiris by killing Seth. After lunch sail to Luxor. Your boat will cross Esna Lock on the way. (B, L, D)

### Day 7: Cruising-Luxor

The morning tour of the West Bank will take you to visit the Valley of the Kings. From Thutmose I in the eighteenth Dynasty of the New Kingdom period all the kings, and occasionally high officials of that period, were buried in the secluded wadi, or dry gully, which today is called Valley of the Kings. Continue your tour with a visit to Queen Hatshepsut's Temple and then admire giant statues called Colossi of Memnon. After lunch travel along the avenue of ramheaded sphinxes to Luxor and Karnak Temple - the main centre of worship in ancient Egypt. (B, L, D)

Sail to Kom Ombo, originally called Nubt, which was named for its references to the 'city of gold'. You will also see the Greco-Roman temple built overlooking the Nile. Sail to Aswan for overnight. (B, L, D)

### Day 6: Aswan-Cruising

Today involves touring Aswan, one of the driest inhabited cities in the world, where you will visit the High Dam and the Egyptian Temple on the Island of Philae in the Nile. This island contains many temples within a complex structure, the most notable being dedicated to the goddess Isis. After lunch sail by felucca around Elephantine Island and the Agha Khan Mausoleum. ### Day 7: Aswan-Cruising

Breakfast on board before a free day at leisure. Opportunity to participate in an optional tour to the site of Abu Simbel, famed for the magnificent statues of Ramses and his wife Nefertari. 



of Arabia, who allegedly washed there. Enjoy a 4WD through this unique valley of coloured sand dunes, surrounded by beautiful rugged mountains. Then, continue to Amman, Jordan's capital city, for your overnight. (B)

### Day 17: Amman-Jerash-Amman

Morning sightseeing of Jerash visiting its churches and Amphitheatres. Jerash located just outside of Amman was inhabited since the Bronze Age. It is best known for the ruins of the walled Greco-Roman settlement. Admire the 2nd-century Hadrian's Arch, the Corinthian columns of the Temple of Artemis, Rainbow street, and the huge Forum's oval colonnade. Take photos at the famour Hyppodrome where the gladiators performed. Continue an Amman city tour, including the Citadel, the Amphitheatre and a panoramic tour of Amman modern city. (B)



# Egypt General Information

### Introduction

Wherever you turn in Egypt, you will be amazed by the history, the culture and the friendliness of the locals. This cradle of civilisation is a living museum which attributes its mysteries to its ancient and current culture. Walk through history, past the Pyramids and numerous temples throughout the country including Abu Simbel, the location of Ramses II, four colossal statues.

### **Population**

Egypt's population is estimated to be approx. 79 million in 2010.

### Time Zone

The time zone of Egypt is two hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time, and therefore, is approx. 7 hours behind AEST in summer, and 9 hours behind during winter.

### Official Language

Arabic is the country's official language, however English is understood in most hotels, restaurants and tourist areas.

A Visa is required when travelling to Egypt and can be obtained through the Embassy or Consulate in Australia or upon arrival at Cairo Airport at the cost is approx A\$45 for a single entry.

### Climate

Egypt has general two seasons, a mild winter from November to April and hot summer from May to October. During the summer months of July and August, temperatures can reach over 40 degrees especially in the south, but generally stay around 35 degrees.

### **Tipping**

Salaries are low and as such tipping, or baksheesh, is expected for almost every service provided. Recommended tips start from A\$1 for porters, \$3-5 for escorts, \$5 for drivers and average \$10 per day for guide or crew during cruises.

### Currency

The Egyptian Pound is the official currency; however USD and Euro are widely accepted. Most credit cards are accepted and ATMs are available.

### Food

Egyptian cuisine is excellent combining aspects of many different cultures which have inhabited Egypt at one time or another. Some of the national specialties include Foul (beans), stuffed vine leaves, grilled aubergines (eggplant) and kebabs, Fesieekh (salted and dried fish), aish baladi (a pita-like bread), and kofta (a spicy, minced lamb).

### Accommodation

The main cities all have hotels ranging from basic to deluxe international standard. Please be aware that the level of quality is different to that offered in Western countries. In general, Egyptian accommodation is of a lower standard, therefore to ensure peace of mind and a comfortable stay, please choose a higher category of accommodation to avoid disappointment.

### Electricity

220 volts, 50hz, as in Aust. A 2 pronged cylindrical plug adapter is required.

### **Getting There**

By Air: Major gateways include Cairo, Luxor and Alexandria. Qatar, Emirates & Etihad have flights from Australia daily. Most major airlines have connections via European cities.



By Sea: The main ports are Port Said or Alexandria however currently there are no cruises going there disembarkation is usually not permitted. There are no ferries linking Egypt and Greece or Italy.

### Getting Around

Getting around independently, in particular Cairo, is generally difficult. Road: Cairo is a large city with a huge Population. Local transport, although existing, is not recommended, due to insufficient traveller information and poor standards. Similar situations exist in most other major cities. While there are taxis available, the quality is usually low, the cars are not air-conditioned and the prices need to be negotiated prior to entering the vehicle. Car rental is not recommended and while you can walk around the city, it can be difficult. Rail: There are several daily services between Alexandria and Cairo & line continues to Luxor and onto Aswan with an overnight train service offering 2 bedded sleeper compartments. This overnight train offer a simple style of accommodation. Trains are delayed

A booking request is accepted when we issue a written booking confirmation. It is at this point that a contract between us and you comes into existence subject to these Booking Conditions. We reserve the right to decline any booking at our discretion. No employee of ours other than a director has the authority to vary or omit any of these Booking Conditions or to promise any discount, refund or credit.

Confirmed bookings will be issued with an invoice upon confirmation detailing all services booked. It is your responsibility to ensure all details are correct. The right is reserved to correct any errors in rates quoted or calculated for any service notwithstanding that the invoice may have been paid in full.

### SERVICES

The services we provide to you are limited to (a) the arrangement and coordination of your travel arrangements; and (b) the delivery of travel arrangements which we directly control. This includes (often significant) work undertaken prior to travel to arrange and coordinate the delivery of your travel arrangements.

### **PRICES & EXCLUSIONS**

Prices stated are in Australian Dollars (\$AUD) and are current at the time of publication unless otherwise indicated. We also sometimes invoice in Euro or New Zealand dollars The price includes accommodation, transportation and other inclusions as per the published itinerary. International and domestic airfares and airport/hotel transfers are not included unless specifically stated. Costs associated with passports, visas, vaccinations, insurance, meals (other than those stipulated), emergency evacuation costs, gratuities, and all items of a personal nature are not included.

### Force Majeure – Prior to travel

- reschedule your travel arrangements (in whole or in part); and/or
