# Portugal General Information

## Introduction

Portugal is a country blessed with an abundance of tranquil landscapes and a warm and vibrant culture. You may indulge your senses at one of the many beautiful beaches that line its coastline or celebrate your social side with shopping and sampling the amazing cuisine that Lisbon and the other cities have on offer. This low-key friendly country is the perfect place to kick back with a drink and watch the sunset over the Atlantic. Explore the romantic city of Porto built along the hillsides overlooking the Douro river. Porto's historical centre is a UNESCO heritage site with many monuments and museums. Fatima, the home of the Catholic pilgrimage site Capelnhada das Aaricoes marks where the Virgin Mary allegedly appeared to three local children. Portugal has all this and more!

## Population

Portugal's population was estimated at 10.25 million in 2019.

## Electricity

The electrical current in Portugal is 230 V, the same as Australia. The standard European plug applies so an adapter (type F) is required.

## Visas

Portugal and other Schengen countries use the European Union Entry/Exit System (EES). This new digital system applies to non-EU travellers, including Australians and NZ entering/leaving the Schengen area. On your first visit, you'll need to; have your fingerprints and photo taken and answer basic questions under the Schengen Border Code. This creates a biometric digital record that will be valid for 3 years. EES registration is free. A stay of no more than 90 days in every 180 days is permitted. Make sure your passport has at least 6 months validity.

## Climate

The climate of Portugal is temperate and influenced by the Atlantic Ocean. In the north, the climate is cooler and rainy, while moving south it becomes gradually warmer and sunnier. In the far south, the region of Algarve has a dry and sunny microclimate. In summer, Portugal is protected by the Azores High, so it's usually sunny everywhere, although some weather fronts can affect the northern part of the country. The average Summer temperatures are around 20 °C in Porto and 23.5 °C in Lisbon. The heat is more intense in the interior, especially in the south-central plains and valleys at low altitudes. Winter is mild on the coast, even in the northern part and the average temperature in January is between 9 °C and 12 °C.

## Official Language

Portuguese is the sole official language of Portugal. Although sharing similarities to Spanish as a Romance language with a plethora of similar words, pronunciation in Portuguese is often completely different. Although English is the second most common language spoken in Portugal, apart from in the major cities and tourist areas, English isn't as widely spoken in Portugal compared to other European countries.

## Time Zone

Portugal (mainland and Madeira) is in the same time zone as Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) and observes daylight saving where time is adjusted forward by 1 hour during European summer months. Therefore, Portugal is 10 hours behind Australian eastern standard time (AEST) during its summer and 11 hours behind during its winter.

## Currency

The currency of Spain is the Euro, and most major credit cards are accepted.

## Tipping

Like most European countries a service charge is added to restaurant bills, although it is customary to leave an additional tip of around 5-10% of the total if satisfied with the service. You may like to round up to the nearest Euro for taxi drivers. For good service on tours, we recommend a tip of approximately A\$10 for tour guides and A\$5 for drivers per day.

## Food

Portugal's cuisine remains a mystery to most food lovers outside of its borders. Only custard tarts —the ubiquitous pastéis de nata have broken into the larger food-obsessed culture. Originating in Lisbon, they were originally invented by monks at Jerónimos Monastery. Pastéis de Belém is the most popular place to buy a pastel de nata in Lisbon.

The roots of Portuguese food lie in both native peasant cooking and ingredients obtained through trade routes established centuries ago. Portuguese cuisine is famous for seafood with Portuguese consumption of fish among the highest in the world. Grilled sardines are a staple, as are clams 'à bulhão pato' cooked with olive oil, white wine, garlic, lemon and coriander; snails, bowls of Caldo Verde (kale soup) and pork sandwiches known as bifanas.

Portugal also has a centuries-long history of producing olive oil that is among the best in the world, as well as wine and cheese. The region's most famous wine is port, made with indigenous grapes like Touriga Nacional in North Portugal's Douro Valley, a UNESCO heritage site. Another high-quality fortified wine is Madeira, named for the

island off Portugal where it's produced. These days, the dry, crisp Vinho Verde, produced in northwest Portugal with grapes like Alvarinho and Loureiro, is also gaining international recognition.

## Shopping

High profile souvenirs include leather goods - shoes, bags and gloves, and ceramics, from traditional azulejo tiles to elaborate figurines, cookware and sculpture. The virtual symbol of Portuguese tourism, the ceramic Barcelos cockerel, perches on many store shelves.

Tapestries are also popular – the areas of Portalegre, Mértola and Monsaraz all have unique weavings you won't find elsewhere. Hand-stitched Arraiolos carpets (from the town of the same name in Alentejo) have a worldwide reputation and are very expensive, although there's nothing to stop you looking.

Hand-woven woollen rugs and blankets that may be hung on a wall are a more realistic buy, with particularly fine examples from Reguengos de Monsaraz (Alentejo). Rustic woolly blankets are also a feature of the mountain villages of the Serra da Estrela – Sabugeiro has hundreds of them displayed in its souvenir shop windows. Vila do Conde (north of Porto) is the best known centre for embroidered linen and lace.

Wine, port and olive oil prove traditional and affordable souvenirs of your visit to Portugal.

## Getting Around

The major cities are well connected by train and bus. A host of small private bus operators, most amalgamated into regional companies, run a dense network of services across the country. Portugal has an extensive railway network, making for scenic travel between destinations. The national train line Comboios de Portugal (CP) runs all trains which are modern and reliable.

Due to well-maintained roads between cities, driving in Portugal is easy. There are some four-lane highways, including one that runs the 300+ miles between Lisbon and Porto; otherwise, expect two-lane roads throughout the country and unpaved, bumpy and sometimes single-lane roads in rural areas.

## Accommodation

Portugal offers a range of accommodation from budget to luxury hotels and apartments. Pousadas offer unique accommodation inside former castles, monasteries and estates. The charming Tourihab properties include manor houses, restored farmhouses and country estates where you can stay as the owner's guest. High season is generally from June to mid-September. In the Algarve, the highest premium for rooms is from July to end of August and a number of Algarve properties close in the winter months.

## Things To Do

**Lisbon:** Lisbon is Portugal's hilly, coastal and cosmopolitan city. From imposing São Jorge Castle, the view encompasses the old city's pastel-coloured buildings. You can easily walk from central Lisbon up the steep hill or take a tram most of the way. Lisbon has two unique monuments which are World Heritage sites - the Jeronimos Monastery and the Tower of Belem. Wander the cobbled streets of bohemian Bairro Alto, ride the Bica Funicular and enjoy dinner at one of the many restaurants. If time permits, take a side-trip to historic Sintra, a Unesco World Heritage site.

**Porto:** Porto is a historic and varied city, from its narrow streets that make up the ancient Ribeira district to the grand plaza of the Trindade district. The region is famed for its production of port, which is still stored and matured in the vast cellars that stretch along the banks of the Douro River. Explore the historic centre (Se district), that Baixa downtown area and the lively Ribeira district with its restaurants, cafes and quirky houses. The Douro is best explored by a boat tour.

**Coimbra:** Coimbra was Portugal's medieval capital for more than a century and is home to the country's oldest and most prestigious university. The steeply stacked historic centre dates to Moorish times and is wonderfully atmospheric, with its dark cobbled lanes and monumental cathedral. On summer evenings, the city's old stone walls reverberate with the haunting metallic notes of the guitarra (Portuguese guitar) and the full, deep voices of fado singers.

**Algarve:** The Algarve is known for its Atlantic beach and golf resorts. Natural treasures include the bird-filled lagoons and islands of the protected Parque Natural da Ria Formosa, stretching for 60 kilometres from west of the capital, Faro to the enchanting fishing village of Cacela Velha. The hinterland comprises historic castle towns, whitewashed villages and rolling countryside of cork and almond trees, citrus orchards and rural farmhouse restaurants.

Cruise or kayak to the extraordinary sea cave at Benagil Caves, outside Carvoeiro. Explore seafaring Lagos' historic walled old town, beautiful beaches and spirited nightlife.

## Best of Northern Portugal 6 Days

**Departs:** Selected Saturdays  
14 Mar 2026-13 Mar 2027

### Day 1 Sat: Lisbon-Óbidos-Alcobaça-Nazaré-Batalha-Fátima

Pick up from selected hotel or meeting point. Depart Lisbon towards Óbidos for a short stop, surrounded by medieval walls to admire the diversity of the handicrafts and taste the famous liquor called "Ginginha". Continue to Alcobaça, dominated by the imposing Site by UNESCO. Continue to Nazara, a typical fishing village with its traditions and legends. Next stop the Batalha Monastery, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.. Proceed to Fátima, locale of the famous Marian Shrine. Overnight in Fátima.

### Day 2 Sun: Fátima-Coimbra-Aveiro-Porto

First stop Coimbra to visit one of the most ancient University sites in the world with its Baroque library. In the afternoon, continue to Aveiro, city of the canals, known as the "Portuguese Venice", where you shall have time to taste the local sweets "Ovos Moles". Drive to Porto. Overnight in Porto. (B)

### Day 3 Mon: Porto-Guimarães-Braga-Porto

Visit the city of Porto in the morning, the 2nd biggest city in Portugal. Discover its avenues, monuments and characteristic places including Exchange Palace, Church of São Francisco and the Ribeira neighbourhood. Visit one of the most traditional Port Wine Cellars where you will have a wine tasting of Port Wine. Continue to the Minho region, where history, religion and legends blend with magnificent monuments, stunning views, delicious cuisine and unique wines. After, visit Guimarães, the cradle of nationality. Then visit Braga, known as the "Rome of Portugal" where you can visit the oldest cathedral in the country and the Sanctuary of Bom Jesus. Return to Porto for overnight. (B)

### Day 4 Tue: Porto-Santiago de Compostela-Porto

Scenic drive from Porto toward Santiago de Compostela, the capital of Galicia and the destination of the pilgrims of the Camino de Santiago. During the day, you have complete freedom to discover this fascinating city. You can stroll through the historic streets, get to know the extraordinary monuments, taste the traditional dishes and visit the imposing Santiago Cathedral. Return to Porto. (B)

### Day 5 Wed: Porto-Amarante-Vila Real-Vale do Douro-Lamego-Urgeirica

Depart to Amarante, a small town located at the banks of the Tâmega river, with its houses with colourful porches and its candy shops with delicious monastic sweets. After, drive to Vila Real where you will visit the gardens of the Manor of Mateus. Then enter in the Port Wine Region. Stop in Lamego, overlooked by one of Portugal's most important shrines, Our Lady of Remedies. You may try some of the local delicacies such as the famous "Bola de Lamego" (a loaf baked in the oven with smoked ham). Overnight in Urgeirica. (B)

### Day 6 Thu: Urgeirica-Bussaco-Tomar-Lisbon

Drive through the heart of Portugal after breakfast until Bussaco, where the romantic Palace Hotel and its luxuriant forest stands out. Continue to Tomar which is closely linked to the Order of the Templars. Visit the Convent of Christ, declared World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1983. Continue the journey to Lisbon. End of Tour. (B)

## Best of Southern Portugal 4 Days

**Departs:** Selected Saturdays  
14 Feb 2026-20 Mar 2027

### Day 1 Sat: Lisbon-Évora

Pick up from selected hotel or proceed on your own to meeting point. Leaving Lisbon, cross the bridge over the Tagus river, where we can enjoy a beautiful and bucolic landscape of olive trees, cork oak trees and vineyards. Arrive in Évora World Heritage Site of UNESCO, visit some of its main monuments: the Roman Temple, the Romanesque-Gothic Cathedral, Saint Francis Church with the "Bones Chapel", and the University. Time for lunch (not included). In the afternoon, free time for a better discover of the city. Overnight in Évora. (B)

### Day 2 Sun: Évora-Beja-Silves-Lagos

Morning at leisure in Évora, and then driving southward passing a relaxing landscape towards Beja for a stop where the most imposing tower of the Portuguese Medieval castles dominates the town and the region. Crossing small mountains, enter in the Algarve, where between fields of orange trees arrive to Silves, dominated by its Moorish Castle and by the memory of its former cork industry. After and passing by Praia da Rocha Beach arrive to Lagos to meet the sea. Overnight in Lagos. (B)

### Day 3 Mon: Lagos-Ponta da Piedade-Sagres-Cabo de S. Vicente-Lagos

Visit to Ponta da Piedade to admire the cliffs which shapes have been sculpted by the erosive action of both, the sea and time. Continue to Sagres, site of the mythical "Navigation School" of Prince Henry the Navigator. At Cabo Sao Vicente, you will be stunned by its cliffs. Arrival to Lagos, a cosmopolitan Algarve town with its marina and fishing port, here you can taste the delicious Algarve gastronomy, rich in fish, shellfish and almond sweets. Free time in the afternoon. Overnight in Lagos. (B)

### Day 4 Tue: Lagos-Setúbal-Serra da Arrábida-Lisbon

Depart for the city of Setubal after breakfast, a major port and industrial centre on the north bank of the Sado estuary, looking to the gorgeous Tróia Peninsula. Then take the scenic route over the Arrabida Mountain, an area preserved as a Natural Park, with an amazing scenery and unique vegetation. Crossing the bridge over the Tagus River arrive at Lisbon. End of tour. (B)

Along the coast pass by the incredible Boca do Inferno, the cosmopolitan Cascais and the gardens of the Casino of Estoril. Return to Lisbon. Overnight in Lisbon. (B)

**Day 8 Sat: Lisbon-Évora**

Leaving Lisbon, cross the bridge over the Tagus river, where we can enjoy a beautiful and bucolic landscape of olive trees, cork oak trees and vineyards. 



These changes may affect prices, duration of tours, itineraries, contents, etc. Information contained in the brochure has been carefully checked and to the best of our knowledge is correct at the time of publishing. Prices and conditions of travel are subject to change without notice.

## VALIDITY:

Brochure is valid 1 January 2026 to 31 October 2026, unless dates under individual land components state otherwise.

## HOW TO BOOK:

Contact your Travel Agent or Greece and Mediterranean Travel Centre Pty Ltd to make your reservations.

A booking request is accepted when we issue a written booking confirmation. It is at this point that a contract between us and you comes into existence subject to these Booking Conditions. We reserve the right to decline any booking at our discretion. No employee of ours other than a director has the authority to vary or omit any of these Booking Conditions or to promise any discount, refund or credit.

Confirmed bookings will be issued with an invoice upon confirmation detailing all services booked. It is your responsibility to ensure all details are correct. The right is reserved to correct any errors in rates quoted or calculated for any service notwithstanding that the invoice may have been paid in full.

## SERVICES

The services we provide to you are limited to (a) the arrangement and coordination of your travel arrangements; and (b) the delivery of travel arrangements which we directly control. This includes (often significant) work undertaken prior to travel to arrange and coordinate the delivery of your travel arrangements.

## PRICES & EXCLUSIONS

### General Cancellations

We will not be responsible for any other loss or loss you incur in connection with your booking (for example, airfares and visa expenses) if you are prevented from commencing or continuing your trip in these circumstances.

### CANCELLATIONS OR RESCHEDULING BY US

In these Booking Conditions, the term Force Majeure means an event or events beyond our control and which we could not have reasonably prevented, and includes but is not limited to: (a) natural disasters (including not limited to flooding, fire, earthquake, landslide, volcanic eruption), adverse weather conditions (including hurricane or cyclone), high or low water levels; (b) war, armed conflict, industrial dispute, civil strife, terrorist activity or the threat of such acts; epidemic, pandemic; (d) any new or change in law, order, decree, rule or regulation of any government authority (including travel advisories and restrictions).

### Force Majeure – Prior to travel

If in our reasonable opinion we (either directly or through our employees, contractors, suppliers or agents) consider that your travel arrangements cannot safely or lawfully proceed due to a Force Majeure Event then we at our discretion may elect to:

- reschedule your travel arrangements (in whole or in part); and/or
- cancel your travel arrangements (in whole or in part), in which case our contract with you will terminate (in whole or in part).

If we cancel any of your travel arrangements, neither of us will have any claim for damages against the other for the cancelled arrangements. However, we will refund payments attributable to the cancelled travel arrangements less: (a) unrecoverable third party costs and other expenses incurred by us for the cancelled travel arrangements; (b) overhead charges incurred by us relative to the price of the cancelled travel arrangements; and (c) fair compensation for work undertaken by us in relation to the cancelled travel arrangements until the time of cancellation and in connection with the processing of any refund.

### Force Majeure – During travel

### Force Majeure – General

### During travel

You agree that we have the right to pass on any costs we incur for alternative arrangements we put in place for your benefit in these circumstances.

### General

To the fullest extent permitted by law, we will not be responsible for any omissions or modifications to the itinerary or the inclusions due to Force Majeure or other circumstances beyond our control happening after we have accepted your booking. This includes any loss of enjoyment or distress caused by omissions or modifications.

If you are entitled to any compensation for any modifications or omissions, then you agree it will be reduced by the value of any alternative services we provide which you accept.

We will not be responsible to you for any other expenses or loss you incur resulting from any amendment or change to the itinerary or its inclusions.

## UNUSED & DENIED SERVICES

No refunds will be made for any travel arrangements not utilised, whether by choice or because of late arrival or early departure. This includes the failure of transport to operate according to schedule, which we disclaim responsibility for.

We will only be responsible for our employees in the course of their employment, and for our agents and suppliers (where we are not the supplier's agent or where the supplier is not an Independent Supplier) if they were carrying out the work we had asked them to do.

We will not be responsible for any loss, damage, claim or expense caused by the acts or omissions of yourself, of any other third party not connected with the provision of the travel arrangements or services, or due to an event of Force Majeure.

While we endeavour to meet scheduled arrival and departure times, we cannot guarantee this. We will not be responsible for any loss or additional expenses you incur for any missed connections/services attributable to delays.

### General liability limitation

You acknowledge that travel arrangements or services which comply with local laws and regulations will be deemed to have been properly performed, even if this would not be considered the case in Australia.

Australian Consumer Law and corresponding legislation in State jurisdictions in certain circumstances imply mandatory conditions and warranties into consumer contracts ("Consumer Warranties"). These Booking Conditions do not exclude or limit the application of the Consumer Warranties. Other than the Consumer Warranties, we disclaim all warranties.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, our maximum liability to you under these Booking Conditions, in tort (including negligence) or at law is limited to arranging for the travel arrangements to be resupplied or payment of the cost of having them resupplied.

## COMPLAINTS

In the event of a problem with any aspect of your travel arrangements you must tell us or make our representative or our local supplier aware of such problems immediately.

We will only consider and be responsible for claims made against us where we or our suppliers have had the opportunity to put things right on the ground. If you notify us of a problem during travel and we haven't resolved it to your satisfaction, then you must make any claim in writing within 30 days from the end of your travel arrangements.

## DEEMED ACCEPTANCE

If you place a booking on behalf of another party, you represent and warrant us that you are duly authorised to provide the agreement and consent of the other party to be bound by these Booking Conditions. You agree that you will be responsible for any loss or damage we incur if this is not the case.

## GENERAL
