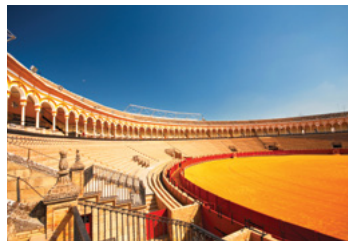

Spain General Information



Introduction

A country which has captivated the hearts of so many tourists for generations, Spain has managed to keep its unique character which makes it one of the most visited countries in Europe. A country which includes a refreshing blend of modern and ancient from the fascinating architectural delight that is the Guggenheim to the Moorish palaces, castles, cathedrals. Wander the streets to discover something new at every turn. Enjoy a country which continues to delight so many people. Enjoy Spain!

Population

Spain's population was estimated at 48 million in 2024.

Time Zone

Spain is one hour ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) and also has daylight saving which is adjusted during summer, the same as the rest of Europe. Therefore during Australian Summer, Spain is 10 hours behind, while only 8 in the winter.

Visas

Spain and other Schengen countries use the European Union Entry/Exit System (EES). This new digital system applies to non-EU travellers, including Australians and NZ entering/leaving the Schengen area. On your first visit, you'll need to; have your fingerprints and photo taken and answer basic questions under the Schengen Border Code. This creates a biometric digital record that will be valid for 3 years. EES registration is free. A stay of no more than 90 days in every 180 days is permitted. Make sure your passport has at least 6 months validity.

Climate

The Mediterranean and Atlantic coasts of Spain are blessed with a Mediterranean climate, while the inland experience more of a continental climate. Summer in Spain is predominantly hot everywhere reaching temperatures of 30°C, apart from the far north where it tends to rain most of the year and winter is generally mild. The ideal months to visit are May, June and September, though April and October is also good for travel to the south.

Official Language

The official language spoken is Spanish with four different dialect existing, Castilian, Catalan, Galician and Basque, however English is also widely spoken.

Electricity

The electrical current in Spain is 220V, while 125V still operates in some older buildings. The standard European plug applies so an adapter is required.

Currency

The currency of Spain is the Euro, and most major credit cards are accepted.

Tipping

Like most European countries, there is a service charge added to most restaurant bills, however you can leave an additional tip if satisfied with the service. Porters in hotels are generally tipped, with most being satisfied with a couple of Euros and it is not required to tip taxi drivers. For good service on tours, we recommend a tip of approx. A\$10 for Tour Guides and A\$5 for bus drivers per day.

Food

The Spanish are passionate about their food. One traditional way to enjoy Spanish food is to try Tapas at one of the many bars scattered around. It is customary to have one tapa and one drink at a bar before moving onto another bar and doing the same. Some essential culinary experiences include the seafood available along the coastlines, where fresh seafood is widely available and affordable. Some Spanish delicacies include some of the many varieties of cheese, including Queso Manchego. Other specialties also include Chorizo, a sausage made from pork, ham, salt, garlic and pepper, Jamón, air dried ham, and Morcilla, a sausage made from pig blood and flavoured with anise. And don't forget to try the famous Spanish dish Paella.

Shopping

Spain is another must see destination for those on the hunt for designer fashion items. There are many designers who sell items that are not readily available outside of Spain. One of the main must buy items from Spain is the famous Kukuxumusu T-shirts, a series of T-shirts which are both funny and involve topics

of Spain as seen by tourists. Other popular items also include leather items, colourful ceramics in the shape of dishes, tiles and vases, and lace.

Getting There

By Air: Emirates, Qatar, Etihad, Singapore Airlines fly daily from most Australian cities to Barcelona and Madrid. There are also daily flights from Athens, Rome and other major European cities.

Getting Around

Hiring a car is easy and can make a trip more pleasant. Main roads are well signposted, and the network is quite extensive, making for a pleasant and wide-ranging self-drive holiday. However be aware that traffic can become congested in major cities. Domestic flights are available, though in common with most European countries, can become quite expensive at times. The train network is mainly between major cities and short distances train services can be subject to long delays, particularly in the Barcelona area. However, longer distance train services always arrive on time. Buses are considered the best way to get around, as local services are fairly frequent and service most towns.

Accommodation

Accommodation in Spain is similar to most countries in that its services range from budget to luxury. There are many different kinds of tourist accommodations, ranging from hotels, pensions, rented villas, to camping or even a stay in a monastery. Other accommodation includes Casa Rural, similar to bed and breakfasts and Paradores (State owned hotels), usually steeped in history and have some of the best locations. Usually a Paradore is a historical conversion of a Moorish castle or hacienda.

Things To Do

Madrid: Within the capital of Spain are many sites to see and activities to do. Among the many Baroque and neoclassical structures, see Casa de Campo, Puerta del Sol, the Mesones and the Old Madrid District. Visit the Plaza de Espana, one of Madrid's largest and most popular squares or one of the three museums.

Barcelona: Of all the sites in Barcelona, La Ramblas is the most famous, revel amongst the performance artists, the rainbow stalls and the kiosks. Other must see attractions of Barcelona include the Barcelona Cathedral, a perfect example of Catalan Gothic architecture, Gaudi's La Sagrada Familia, the Gothic Quarter, Plaza Sant Jaume, Saint Jordi Palace, Caltrava Tower and the Olympic Village. Perhaps take a day trip to Monserrat, site of the Royal Basilica and the infamous sculpture of the "Black Virgin".

Seville: Also known as Seville, is the location of one of the most beautiful parks in all of Europe, the Park of Maria Luisa. Also visit the Cathedral, this Gothic structure is known as the third largest Cathedral in the world, the Santa Cruz Quarter, Old Jewish Quarter and the Spanish Square.

Cordoba: Once an important Roman town, in the 9th and 10th centuries, was the capital of Caliphate, and one of the most populous cities in the world. See the Mosque, Jewish Quarter and marvel at the architecture left behind by a society of Muslims, Christians and Jews.

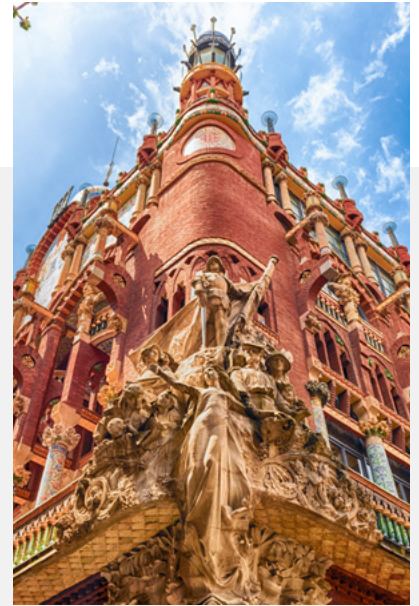
Costa Del Sol: Also known as the sun coast, the Costa Del Sol region offers many beautiful cities including Málaga, the capital of the Costa Del Sol and includes popular sites such as the stronghold of Alcazaba and Gibralfaro Castle, known as the best preserved Arab monument. Roman monuments and structures scatter the town including the roman Theatre, Customhouse and the Catholic Cathedral, commissioned to cover the site of an ancient mosque.

Other Destinations: A visit to the Museo Guggenheim in Bilbao to admire the architectural wonder is recommended. Another worthwhile visit is to Granada. Enjoy a city tour which encompasses the main sights of this interesting city including the Generalife Gardens and the last stronghold of the Moorish Kingdoms, the Alhambra. Visit Valencia, known as the birthplace of the famous Paella and admire the many domes and spires of the Zaragoza Cathedral.

Barcelona, Mediterranean Coast, Andalusia & Madrid

9 Days

Departs: Mondays

Day 1 Mon: Barcelona

Arrival at the airport and transfer to your hotel. Join your Travel Director and your group members for a Welcome Dinner. Overnight at ABBA Sants, Catalonia Plaza or similar. (D)

Day 2 Tue: Barcelona

After breakfast, take a morning city tour of Barcelona. Drive along the main avenues with its impressive Gaudi modernist buildings such as La Pedrera and Casa Batlló. The Montjuïc Park with spectacular views of the city and harbor, Olympic Ring, monument to Columbus and the Olympic Port. Visit the most important landmark in the city of Barcelona, Sagrada Familia. Continuing to Valencia, where we taste a typical "horchata" (tiger milk) and have the opportunity to explore the city from the old town and the exterior of the most avant-garde complex: Ciudad de las Artes y las Ciencias. Overnight EXE Rey Don Jaime, Eurostars Acteon or similar. (B)

Day 4 Thu: Valencia-Granada

After breakfast, we continue towards Andalusia to reach Granada. This city, located at the foot of Sierra Nevada, between the Darro and Genil rivers, is one of the jewels of Andalusia. Here, the impressive Andalusian legacy, represented by the Alhambra, is complemented by Renaissance architectural gems. We have the chance to learn how to dance flamenco before dinner and show. After dinner, we invite you to take the opportunity to enjoy the wonderful views of Granada from one of the city's viewpoints. Overnight at Abades Recogidas, Meliá Granada or similar. (B, D)

Day 5 Fri: Granada-Seville

Today, visit the world-famous Alhambra complex and Generalife Gardens. Then, among olive trees and white villages, we continue to Seville, the capital of Andalusia. Tonight, enjoy dinner with your group and discover together the traditional Andalusian cuisine. Overnight at Barceló Renacimiento, Hesperia Sevilla or similar. (B, D)

Day 6 Sat: Seville

Breakfast at the hotel. Morning city tour of the Andalusian Capital, Seville. Visit the Cathedral, the second largest in the Catholic world after St. Peters in Rome. Continue to Santa Cruz quarter, the natural scenario of Carmen as well as the myth of Don Juan, Maria Luisa Park and Plaza de España. Afternoon at leisure for you to enjoy the city of light. 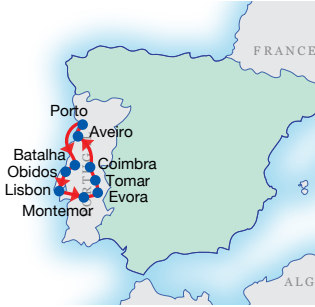

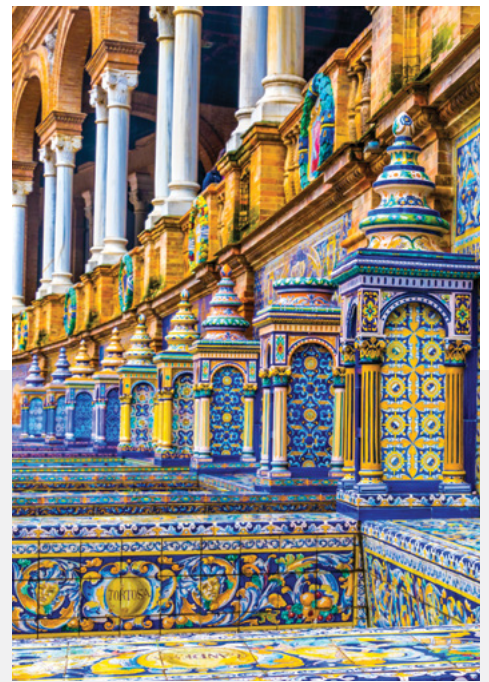

In the morning, we recommend a self-guided exploration of the renowned Mosque, celebrated as one of the most exquisite historical mosques. Following this visit, discover the enchanting Jewish Quarter, characterized by its quaint and narrow streets, typical Andalusian "patios," and the presence of one of Spain's few impeccably preserved synagogues. Overnight in Cordoba.

Day 2: Cordoba-Seville

After breakfast, we suggest continuing your exploration of this historically rich city. Later in the morning, board a high-speed train bound for Sevilla, with a brief travel time of 45 minutes. As you explore the old town, discover grand palaces and enjoy magnificent views of the countryside. Noteworthy landmarks include the 1784 bullring, the oldest in Spain. Conclude your day's journey with a continuation to Torremolinos for overnight. (B)

Day 6: Torremolinos-Malaga

After breakfast, drop of the car at the Malaga Airport. End of services. (B)

However, we will refund payments attributable to the cancelled travel arrangements less: (a) unrecoverable third party costs and other expenses incurred by us for the cancelled travel arrangements; (b) overhead charges incurred by us relative to the price of the cancelled travel arrangements; and (c) fair compensation for work undertaken by us in relation to the cancelled travel arrangements until the time of cancellation and in connection with the processing of any refund.

Force Majeure – During travel

If due to Force Majeure we cancel travel arrangements after your trip has commenced, we will provide you with a refund of recoverable third party costs for cancelled travel arrangements only.

Force Majeure – General

If we provide you with any alternative services or assistance where travel arrangements are cancelled or rescheduled due to Force Majeure, then you agree the amount to be refunded to you will be reduced by the value of these services and assistance.

You acknowledge that the terms in this section are reasonably necessary to protect our legitimate business interests. We strongly encourage you to purchase travel insurance that adequately responds to cancellation and rescheduling risks associated with Force Majeure events.

Other cancellations

If we cancel your travel arrangements for reasons other than Force Majeure, you will be offered (at your election) a refund of all funds paid, or the offer of a trip of substantially equal quality if appropriate.

We will not be responsible to you for any other expenses or loss you incur if your travel arrangements are rescheduled or cancelled whether or not due to Force Majeure.

AMENDMENTS BY YOU

We will endeavour to accommodate amendments and additional requests. You acknowledge that these may not be possible to fulfil, and for group departures a transfer of a booking to a different departure is deemed a cancellation. An amendment fee of \$50 will be levied to cover communication and administration costs for any changes to bookings. You will also be required to pay any additional costs charged by suppliers.

Booking Conditions (continued)

AMENDMENTS BY US

Prior to travel

Occasionally, we may need to make amendments or modifications to the itinerary and its inclusions and you acknowledge our right to do this. If we become aware of a significant change to your itinerary or its inclusions prior to the commencement of your trip (where the trip can still proceed), then we will notify you within a reasonable time.

During travel

You acknowledge that the itinerary, modes of transport, accommodation and/or the trip's inclusions may need to change during your trip due to local circumstances beyond our reasonable control, including road conditions, poor weather, changes in transport schedules, and/or vehicle breakdowns. You agree that we have the right to pass on any costs we incur for alternative arrangements we put in place for your benefit in these circumstances.

General

To the fullest extent permitted by law, we will not be responsible for any omissions or modifications to the itinerary or the inclusions due to Force Majeure or other circumstances beyond our control happening after we have accepted your booking. This includes any loss of enjoyment or distress caused by omissions or modifications.

If you are entitled to any compensation for any modifications or omissions, then you agree it will be reduced by the value of any alternative services we provide which you accept.

We will not be responsible to you for any other expenses or loss you incur resulting from any amendment or change to the itinerary or its inclusions.

UNUSED & DENIED SERVICES

No refunds will be made for any travel arrangements not utilised, whether by choice or because of late arrival or early departure. This includes the failure of transport to operate according to schedule, which we disclaim responsibility for.

If you are not fully and validly vaccinated against Covid-19 in the destination(s) where services are to be provided, and particular suppliers refuse to provide you with travel arrangements, then you agree you will not be entitled to any refund for those arrangements. We will not be responsible to you for any loss or expenses you incur (including loss of enjoyment or the costs of alternative arrangements) if you are denied services in these circumstances.

CLIENT NAMES – EXACTLY AS PER PASSPORT

For security reasons, airlines and our overseas suppliers require names to be given exactly as stated in your passport. If you do not advise the correct information and we have to re-issue airline tickets or other documentation, then you will be responsible for any fees charged (such as airline cancellation charges or re-issue fees) in addition to our own reasonable administration fees.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

Travel Documents cannot be issued until full payment is received and will be available no later than 14 days prior to departure. All documents for bookings under \$2000 will be available in electronic format only. For last minute bookings paid less than 14 days prior to client's departure, the documents will be provided in electronic format regardless of the value of the services.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

It is strongly encouraged that you are adequately insured for the duration of your trip. We recommend comprehensive travel insurance to cover cancellation, medical requirements, luggage, repatriations and additional expenses. The choice of insurer is yours. We strongly suggest you purchase insurance at the time you pay your deposit. This is because cancellation fees and charges are payable from that time.

We reserve the right to substitute hotels, vessels and other forms of accommodation with properties or vessels of a comparable or higher standard.

INFORMATION & DESCRIPTIONS

HEALTH & FITNESS

It is your responsibility to ensure that you have a suitable level of health and fitness to undertake the trip of your choice.

If you suffer from a medical condition which may reasonably be expected to increase your risk of needing medical attention, or which may affect the normal conduct of the trip, then you must advise us at the time you make your booking request.

We may request you to provide an assessment of your medical condition from a qualified medical practitioner. If the assessment indicates that you will require special assistance from personnel which we cannot reasonably provide, then we may cancel your booking. Provided you notified us of your medical condition at the time you made your booking request, we will provide you with a full refund of payments made. If you fail to notify us at that time or if you fail to provide a medical assessment within a reasonable time of our request, then this will be considered a cancellation by you.

We reserve the right to cancel your booking if any changed or non-disclosed medical conditions mean that you will require special assistance which we cannot reasonably provide.

We strongly suggest that your travel insurance policy includes comprehensive cancellation coverage.

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

Special dietary requests are required to be notified to us at the time of booking. Although we will use reasonable endeavours to accommodate requests, we cannot guarantee requests will be met by suppliers. AUTHORITY ON TOUR

We are not responsible for any additional activities or excursions which are not included in the booked itinerary or which we sell as agent for the principal operator. Any advice or recommendation made by a guide or local representative does not make us responsible.

ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

You acknowledge that travel involves personal risks which may be greater than those present in your everyday life. This could be as a result of the adventurous nature of your trip or the visiting of destinations which present geographical, political or cultural risks and dangers.

You should consult guidance issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) applicable to the destinations within your itinerary. You acknowledge that your choice to travel is made having had the benefit of DFAT guidance, and you accept any additional personal risks associated with your travel. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we disclaim any liability for these risks.

RESPONSIBILITY

Services supplied by independent suppliers

Where a third party over whom we have no direct control (**Independent Supplier**) is the supplier of travel arrangements that form part of your trip, you acknowledge that our obligations to you are limited to taking reasonable steps to select a reputable Independent Supplier and arranging for them to provide those travel arrangements to you. Independent Suppliers over whom we have no direct control include but are not limited to airlines, railway and cruise operators, hoteliers, independent transport companies (i.e., vehicles not operated by us) and common carriers.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, we will not be responsible to you for any loss, damage, personal injury or delay attributable to the actions or omissions of an Independent Supplier. Any claims you have in this regard must be made against the Independent Supplier. You acknowledge that the Independent Supplier's liability to you may be limited by their own terms and conditions.

Services we directly supply

To the extent only that we are the principal supplier to you of travel arrangements or other services which we control, then we will provide those travel arrangements and services with reasonable skill and care.

We will only be responsible for our employees in the course of their employment, and for our agents and suppliers (where we are not the supplier's agent or where the supplier is not an Independent Supplier) if they were carrying out the work we had asked them to do.

We will not be responsible for any loss, damage, claim or expense caused by the acts or omissions of yourself, of any other third party not connected with the provision of the travel arrangements or services, or due to an event of Force Majeure.

While we endeavour to meet scheduled arrival and departure times, we cannot guarantee this. We will not be responsible for any loss or additional expenses you incur for any missed connections/services attributable to delays.

General liability limitation

You acknowledge that travel arrangements or services which comply with local laws and regulations will be deemed to have been properly performed, even if this would not be considered the case in Australia.

Australian Consumer Law and corresponding legislation in State jurisdictions in certain circumstances imply mandatory conditions and warranties into consumer contracts ("Consumer Warranties"). These Booking Conditions do not exclude or limit the application of the Consumer Warranties. Other than the Consumer Warranties, we disclaim all warranties.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, our maximum liability to you under these Booking Conditions, in tort (including negligence) or at law is limited to arranging for the travel arrangements to be resupplied or payment of the cost of having them resupplied.

COMPLAINTS

In the event of a problem with any aspect of your travel arrangements you must tell us or make our representative or our local supplier aware of such problems immediately.

We will only consider and be responsible for claims made against us where we or our suppliers have had the opportunity to put things right on the ground. If you notify us of a problem during travel and we haven't resolved it to your satisfaction, then you must make any claim in writing within 30 days from the end of your travel arrangements.

DEEMED ACCEPTANCE

If you place a booking on behalf of another party, you represent and warrant us that you are duly authorised to provide the agreement and consent of the other party to be bound by these Booking Conditions. You agree that you will be responsible for any loss or damage we incur if this is not the case.

GENERAL
