



**Departs:** Thursdays

**Day 1 Thu: Istanbul**

Arrive in Istanbul and transfer to your hotel. Welcome briefing in the evening. Overnight Burdock Autograph Collection hotel.

**Day 2 Fri: Istanbul-Sightseeing**

Enjoy a full day tour including a visit to Topkapi Palace Museum, residence of the Ottoman Sultans between 1453–1852 (excluding harem). Visit the Hippodrome, which was once the center of life where chariot racing and other public events took place. Tour the Blue Mosque built between 1609 and 1616, famous for its blue ceramic tiles. See St. Sophia, a church built in the 6th century Byzantine capital, converted to a mosque by the Ottomans, still inhabited as a mosque in the present day and one of the world's greatest architectural wonders. Last stop will be the famous Grand Bazaar. *Optional:* Dinner with belly-dancing and entertainment. Overnight Burdock Auograph Collection hotel. (B)



**Day 3 Sat: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Canakkale**

Depart for Gallipoli, the site of many battles during WWI. Visit Anzac Cove, Lone Pine Cemetery, and Chunuk Bair, then overnight in Canakkale at Double Tree by Hilton or similar. (B)

**Day 4 Sun: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Izmir**

Visit Troy with its famous wooden horse, best known for being the setting of the Trojan War and many cities built on top of each other. Before arriving into Asklepion, enjoy lunch with locals in a traditional local village. Continue to Pergamum to visit the ancient Medical Center in Asklepion and then continue to Izmir for overnight at Swiss - Grand Ephesus or similar. (B, L)

**Day 5 Mon: Izmir-Ephesus & St Mary's House-Izmir**

Tour the famous ruins of Ephesus, an important cultural center of the ancient world, and explore 2,000-year-old marble streets, a theater, the Library of Celsius, a gymnasium, and Hadrian's Temple. Take a short drive to see St. Mary's stone cottage where it is believed Virgin Mary spent her last years accompanied by St. John. Continue to a regional rug production center to have a firsthand experience of this unique art form. Overnight in Izmir at Swiss - Grand Ephesus or similar. (B, D)

**Day 6 Tue: Izmir-Bodrum**

After breakfast, drive to Bodrum to visit the castle of St. Peter and the renowned Underwater Museum that was awarded the best Underwater Museum of the World in the 2000s. Overnight in Bodrum at Ramada Bodrum Hotel or similar. (B)

**Day 7 Wed: Bodrum**

After breakfast, free time for personal activities. *Optional* tour to Kos Island. Overnight in Bodrum at Ramada Bodrum Hotel or similar. (For Kos: Only roundtrip ferry ticket will be provided). (B)

**Day 8 Thu: Bodrum-Pamukkale**

After breakfast, drive through lush valleys to Pamukkale, the Cotton Fortress, with white lime cascades formed by hot mineral springs. Visit ruins of the Roman health spa of Hierapolis and enjoy a swim in hotel's thermal pool. Overnight in Doga Thermal Hotel or similar. (B, D)

**Day 9 Fri: Pamukkale-Antalya**

After breakfast, depart for Antalya, a resort city and gateway to Turkey's southern Mediterranean region, known as the Turquoise Coast for its blue waters. Remnants remain from Antalya's time as a major Roman port, including Hadrian's Gate, built to honour the Roman emperor's visit in 130 AD and the 2nd century Hidirlik Tower, with its beautiful views of Antalya Bay. Dinner and overnight at The Marmara Antalya Hotel or similar. (B, D)

**Day 10 Sat: Perge-Aspendos-Antalya**

Spend a full day at leisure, or join the *optional* tour to Perge & Aspendos. Afternoon is free for personal activities. Dinner and overnight at The Marmara Antalya Hotel or similar. (B, D)

**Day 11 Sun: Antalya-Cappadocia**

Early morning departure to Cappadocia with a visit to the 13th century Caravanserai and later visit the underground city of Saratli. Dinner and overnight in Cappadocia at Hotel Gamirasu or similar. (B, D)

**Day 12 Mon: Cappadocia**

Early Morning *Optional:* Hot Air Balloon Tour. Experience floating through volcanic valleys, fairy chimneys, and caves at sunrise. After breakfast, visit Goreme, a historical region of Turkey, located among the rock formations, which were first settled back in the Roman period. Many rock churches can still be observed today, as Christianity was then the prevailing religion in that region. Continue to the town of Avanos renowned for its high-quality pottery. Also visit Devrent and Red Valley, and attend a brief regional pottery workshop. Dinner at the Hotel. Join an *optional* Whirling Dervishes performance. Overnight at Hotel Gamirasu or similar. (B, D)

**Day 13 Tue: Cappadocia-Ankara**

Early morning departure to the capital city of Ankara through the Salt Lake area. Visit the Mausoleum of Ataturk, the father of modern Turkey. Overnight in Ankara at JW Marriott Hotel or similar. (B, D)

**Day 14 Wed: Ankara-Istanbul**

After breakfast, depart for Istanbul. In the afternoon, join an *optional* half-day Bosphorus cruise enjoying the strait that separates Asia and Europe. Its shores are lined with fine neighbourhoods, Ottoman palaces, fortresses, old wooden villas, hotels, parks and gardens, restaurants, and cafés. Finish some last-minute shopping at the Spice Market filled with the fragrance of the exotic east. Tonight enjoy a farewell dinner and overnight at Burdock Autograph Collection or similar. (B, D)

**Day 15 Thu: Istanbul**

Istanbul After breakfast transfer to Istanbul Airport. (B)

# Jewels of Turkey

**Departs:** Saturdays

*Note: This tour can also start on Sundays with 1 night accommodation & sightseeing in Istanbul at the end instead of the beginning of the tour.*

**Day 1 Sat: Istanbul**

Upon arrival you will be met by our representative and transferred to your Hotel. Rest of day at your own leisure.

Overnight at Double Tree By Hilton Piyalepasa or similar.

**Day 2 Sun: Istanbul**

Full day guides tour of most fascinating sites of Istanbul. First stop is Topkapi

Palace, a setting for state occasions and royal entertainments of the Ottoman Sultans, then visit the famous Hagia Sophia as well the Sultan Ahmet Mosque. Known to many as the Blue Mosque, this practicing mosque gains its nickname from the thousands of blue tiles which adorn the interior. Afternoon visit to Spice Bazaar. Overnight at Doubletree by Hilton Piyalepasa. (B)

**Day 3 Mon: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Canakkale**

Morning drive south to the Gallipoli peninsula with the Aegean Sea to the west and the Dardanelles straits to the east. Visit Anzac Cove, Nek, Chunuk Bair, and Lone Pine before crossing the Dardanelles by car ferry to Canakkale. Dinner and overnight at Kolin Hotel. (B, D)

**Day 4 Tue: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Kusadasi**

This morning continue south to the legendary site of Troy, now known to all as the location where the Trojan War took place. Walk the same streets where the Hero Hector once strode. After crossing Mount Ida arrive to Pergamum. Explore this ancient city perched atop a high acropolis. See the ruined temples and amphitheatre before getting back onto the coach for the drive to Kusadasi. Overnight in Kusadasi at Elite World Hotel. (B, D)

**Day 5 Wed: Kusadasi-Ephesus-Sirince-Kusadasi**

After breakfast visit Turkey's most famous site: Greco-Roman city of Ephesus. See the colonnaded streets, temples, tombs and even toilets. Continue on to the marvellous



village of Sirince where we will be able to do shopping and taste delicious wines. Return to Kusadasi for overnight at Elite World Hotel. (B, D)

**Day 6 Thu: Kusadasi-Pamukkale**

This morning drive through the lush plains and cotton farms to Pamukkale. Enjoy some free time at the lime cascades and discover the histories behind the ancient spa retreat of Hierapolis. Perhaps experience some of the delights the ancients felt while swimming in Cleopatra's pool. Dinner and overnight in Pamukkale at Adem Pira Hotel. (B, D)

**Day 7 Fri: Pamukkale-Koycegiz-Fethiye**

Drive to the lakeside town Koycegiz, where we take a boat cruise to Turtle Beach and enjoy some pampering at the local mudbath. Continue to Fethiye for overnight at Marina Boutique Hotel. (B, D)

**Day 8 Sat: Fethiye-Kayakoy-Oludeniz-Fethiye**

Visit the Greek Village of Kayakoy. Once a thriving Greek town with over 1000 houses, two churches, 14 chapels and two schools, deserted when the 25,000 Greeks were repatriated to Greece. Explore the ghost town before driving on to Oludeniz for opportunity see the famed Blue Lagoon. Enjoy swimming in the crystal clear waters or sunbathing on the golden sandy beach. Overnight at Marina Boutique Hotel. (B)

**Day 9 Sun: Fethiye-Antalya**

Today we will drive to Antalya. Take a walk in the Old Town featuring beautiful architecture and see the Hadrian Gate. Then also visit Duden Waterfalls in Lara. Overnight Antalya at B.W. Khan hotel. (B, D)

**Day 10 Mon: Antalya-Aspendos-Konya-Cappadocia**

After breakfast departure to Konya, stopping enroute at Aspendos and view its majestic theatre. Upon arrival in Konya, tour the monastery of the Mevlana and his Whirling Dervishes. Visit the museum and learn the history behind this unusual dance and religion. Afternoon drive to Cappadocia via Seljuk a fine example of an ancient Silk Road. Overnight and dinner in Cappadocia at Crowne Plaza Nevsehir. (B, D)

**Day 11 Tue: Cappadocia**

Full day touring the unique region of Cappadocia known for its landscapes and Fairy Chimneys. First stop is to the Kaymakli underground city. One of the largest underground settlements, the tunnels and rooms are still used today for storage, cellars and stables. Continue on to the Open Air Museum at Goreme, a reminder of

the Christians who once used the natural landscape to hide from the raiding Muslim parties. Finish the day with a visit to the natural fortress in Uchisar. Optional Turkish Folklore evening with dinner. Overnight in Cappadocia at Crowne Plaza Nevsehir. (B)

**Day 12 Wed: Cappadocia-Ankara-Safranbolu**

Optional morning balloon ride to enjoy watching the sun rise from the air over the fantastic scenery below. After breakfast at the hotel, depart for Safranbolu via the capital of Turkey. Upon arrival in Ankara, visit the Mausoleum of the founder of the Republic of Turkey, Ataturk. Visit the museum detailing specific events of Turkey's history. Continue on to the city named after Saffron, Safranbolu, which is still produced today, nearby. Dinner and overnight at a special category traditional hotel - Imren Lokum Konagi. (B, D)

**Day 13 Thu: Safranbolu-Istanbul**

Today enjoy a morning tour of the interesting UNESCO World Heritage Listed village of Safranbolu. Be sure to taste some of its famed Turkish Delight before the drive back to Istanbul. Upon arrival, enjoy an afternoon visit to the Grand Bazaar. Overnight in Istanbul at The Kent hotel in old town. (B)

**Day 14 Fri: Istanbul**

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer at 9am or 13:00 to Istanbul Airport airport. (B)

## Black Sea Extension

**Day 14 Fri: Instabul-Trabzon**

After breakfast transfer to Istanbul airport for flight to Trabzon. Visit Sumela Monastery nestled into the side of rocks in a famous valley in Macka. The 1000-year-old Monastery of the Virgin Mary at Sumela is among the most impressive sights of Turkey's Black Sea coast. It's 35 to 45-minute hike uphill from the parking lot to the monastery entrance. The land around the monastery is now preserved as Altindere National Park. Transfer to Novotel Hotel. (B)

**Day 15 Sat: Trabzon-Istanbul**

After breakfast, transfer to airport for flight back to Istanbul. Transfer to hotel. Day at leisure. (B)

**Day 16 Sun: Istanbul**

After breakfast transfer to the Istanbul Airport at 09:00 or 13:00. (B)

**Day 1 Fri: Istanbul**

Upon your arrival, you will be met by our representative before transfer to your Hotel. Overnight Arena hotel old town.

**Day 2 Sat: Istanbul Full Day tour**

Arriving into Cavusin town walk up to the old city carved on to the rocks and see the Church of St. John the Baptist, one of the oldest cave churches in Cappadocia. Next head to Ortahisar via the Rose Valley. After visiting the picturesque Ortahisar Castle continue to Uzengi Valley, our drive takes us along the brook bank, where we'll be able to see the pigeon houses carved into the rocks. Later we arrive into Mustafapasa Village (Sinassos), a former Greek town that was inhabited by the Greeks until the population exchange in 1924. After some relaxing time in the town drive back to Goreme via Pancarlik, Pigeons and Babaccik valleys. After the tour transfer to MDC Cave Hotel or Yusuf Yigitoglu in Cappadocia. (B, D)

**Day 4 Mon: Cappadocia Full Day tour**

Early in the morning an optional Balloon tour is available. Then, full day excursion in Cappadocia including visits to the Kaymakli Underground City, Open Air Museum in Goreme and natural fortress in Uchisar. Lunch in a cave rest. After breakfast cross the Dardanelles and continue to Gallipoli, the famous site where so many Australians lost their lives during the battles in 1915. Stop at Anzac Cove, the Nek, Chunuk Bair, Lone Pine, and see the 57th Regiment Memorial. Continue to Istanbul for overnight at Kent Hotel. (B)

7 Days

**Departs:** Saturdays

**Day 1 Sat: Istanbul**

On arrival transfer from Istanbul Atatürk airport to hotel. Tonight you have a welcome meeting in Doubletree by Hilton Piyalepa Hotel.

**Day 2 Sun: Istanbul**

After breakfast at the hotel, we will have a full day guided tour including visits to: Topkapi Palace, Hippodrome Square – the place of the Roman races, Blue Mosque and the Grand Bazaar where you can purchase some incredible bargains. Continue to Hagia Sophia, unquestionably one of the finest buildings of all time. Built by Constantine the Great, its immense dome rises 55m above the ground. This building has been a Cathedral, Catholic Church, Mosque and now Museum. Tour concludes with a visit to Spice Bazaar. Overnight at Doubletree by Hilton Piyalepa. (B, D)

**Day 3 Mon: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Canakkale**

Morning departure to Gallipoli, which is most notable for the offensive waged by the Allies, including Australia and New Zealand, in World War I. Pay your respects at ANZAC Cove and visit The Nek, Chunuk Bair, Lone Pine and the 57th Regiment Memorial. Afterwards cross the Dardanelles and overnight in Canakkale at Kolin Hotel. (B, D)

**Day 4 Tue: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Kusadasi**

Drive to Troy, a city well-known to both history and legend (as well as archaeology). It is best known for being the setting of the Trojan War described in the Greek Epic Cycle and especially in the Illiad, one of the two epic poems attributed to Homer. Afterwards the tour will cross the legendary Mount Ida and continue to Pergamum to visit the Acropolis. Dramatic perched atop a steep sided hill to the northeast of the modern city centre. 



#### Day 1: Istanbul

Upon arrival at the airport meet a representative, who will assist with the transfer to the Arena Hotel. Located in the Old City section of Istanbul the hotel is an excellent example of a traditional 19th Century Ottoman stone house.

#### Day 2: Istanbul

After breakfast at your hotel enjoy a full day private guided tour of Istanbul. This includes St Sophia, the cathedral built by Emperor Justinian in 537, the Byzantine Hippodrome with its various monuments including a 3500-year-old red granite obelisk brought from Egypt in 390 AD. The Ottoman Empire produced marvellous architecture and during the tour you can see two of its finest works: Topkapi Palace, home of the Sultans, and the famed Blue Mosque of Sultan Ahmet I. After all these visits, venture into the labyrinthine Grand Bazaar - one of the largest and oldest covered markets in the world. Transfer back to the Arena Hotel for overnight is included. (B)

#### Day 3: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Assos

Today travel to Gallipoli where the guide will take you through the significant sites of the ANZAC. You may choose to enjoy lunch at Maydos restaurant overlooking Canakkale Harbour. Afterwards continue on to Anzac Cove, Nek, Chunuk Bair, Lone Pine and 57th Regiment Memorial. From there cross the Dardanelles, a narrow strait connecting the Aegean Sea and the Sea of Marmara. Overnight stay at Nazlihan boutique Hotel in Assos. Nazlihan Boutique Hotel, with a magnificent location on antique seaport. (B, D)

#### Day 4: Assos-Troy-Pergamum-Kusadasi

Drive to legendary Troy; a 5000 year old archaeological city. See a reconstruction of the Wooden Horse, which was used in Trojan War, then cross the legendary Mount Ida to Pergamum. Visit the Acropolis of this ancient city, one of Turkey's oldest civilised settlements, which has been inhabited from prehistoric times through the Ionic, Roman and Byzantine Civilisations. This area is fascinating for history-loving tourists. It has yielded archaeological treasures whose importance is recognised worldwide. Continue to Kusadasi for overnight stay at the Efe Boutique Hotel. Located on the harbour the Efe offers stunning views of the coast of Kusadasi from the modern and stylish interiors. All within walking distance of the city's centre. (B, D)

#### Day 5: Kusadasi-Ephesus-Kusadasi

In the morning be driven to Ancient city of Ephesus to explore some of the best preserved ancient theatres, fountains and buildings in the world. A definite must while in Turkey. After lunch climb the hill to visit the House of Mother Mary where she is thought to have spent her last years together with St. John. Return to Kusadasi for overnight stay at the Efe Boutique Hotel. Enjoy a splendid dinner at a fine restaurant overlooking Kusadasi Harbour. (B, D)

#### Day 6: Kusadasi-Hierapolis-Pamukkale-Marmaris

After breakfast drive through the meandering plains and cotton farms, before arriving in Pamukkale. Once here enjoy the beauty of lime cascades and visit ancient Hierapolis - which has the biggest Necropolis (with 1200 gravestones) in Turkey. The Sacred Pool is also one of the highlights of the site. There shallow thermal waters ripple over a wonderful scattering of ancient Roman ruins that lie beneath. Afterwards return to your hotel to relax in the hot spring pool. Continue on to Marmaris for overnight at the Orsmaris Boutique. Dinner at the hotel's restaurant included. (B, D)

#### Day 7: Marmaris-Koycegiz-Fethiye

In the morning drive to the beautiful lakeside town of Koycegiz. On arrival board a boat cruise to the beautiful Turtle Beach (Iztuzu Beach) and smoother yourself in the rejuvenating mud of the mudbaths. Afterwards transfer back to the Marina Boutique



Hotel to spend the night. Just five minutes from downtown Fethiye the hotel has a contemporary minimalist design encased in Mediterranean architecture. In the evening enjoy an authentic Turkish food at a restaurant in beautiful Fethiye. (B, D)

#### Day 8: Fethiye-Kayakoy-Oludeniz-Fethiye

After breakfast explore the quaint Greek village of Kayakoy. This ghost town is now preserved as a museum village, and consists of hundreds of rundown but still mostly intact Greek-style houses and churches which cover a small mountainside. In the afternoon visit Oludeniz. Take the opportunity to swim and then drive back to the Marina Boutique Hotel for overnight in Fethiye. (B, D)

#### Day 9: Fethiye-Saklikent Gorge-Antalya

Today visit the stunning, beautiful Saklikent Gorge, Turkey's longest and deepest canyon. After tracking along the canyon, continue to Antalya crossing the Taurus mountains. Upon arrival visit the amazing Duden Waterfall. Overnight and dinner at the Mediterra Art Hotel in Antalya. The hotel is formed by three buildings and has been renovated to reflect the Ottoman architecture including ancient fireplaces and handmade doors and wardrobes. (B, D)

#### Day 10: Konya-Cappadocia

Early departure for Konya. On the way stop at the Aspendos Ancient Theatre. On arrival in Konya tour the monastery of the Mevlana Whirling Dervishes. In the afternoon drive to Cappadocia via Seljuk - a fine example of an ancient Silk Road Inn. Overnight and dinner in Cappadocia at the Gamirasu Cave Hotel. Gamirasu is an exquisitely restored small troglodyte cave house. The hotel is located in a restored thousand-year-old Byzantine monastic retreat which offers modern conveniences like swimming pool and restaurant without distracting from the spiritual feeling of the area which has been known to be inhabited for more than 5000 years. Gamirasu has been featured on Channel 9's Getaway Program. (B, D)

#### Day 11: Cappadocia

After breakfast enjoy a full day exploring Cappadocia including visits to the Kaymakli Underground City, the place early Christians hid from persecutors, Open Air Museum in Goreme to see the best examples of Byzantine art in Cappadocia in rock-cut churches with frescoes and paintings (10th to 13th century) and natural fortress in Uchisar. Tonight have dinner at a unique cave restaurant. Overnight stay in Cappadocia. (B, D)

#### Day 12: Cappadocia-Ankara-Safranbolu

Very early morning optional hot air balloon tour. After breakfast depart for Safranbolu. On the way stop by Ankara to visit the Mausoleum of Ataturk and the Museum in Ankara. This is the burial place of the national hero who founded modern Republic of Turkey. Afterwards continue to Safranbolu, the UNESCO World Heritage Town considered to be an open air museum. Overnight at the Imren Lokum Konak Boutique Hotel. (B, D)

#### Day 13: Safranbolu-Istanbul

After breakfast visit the old town of Safranbolu where you can test the fine sample of Turkish delights then continue to drive to Istanbul to check in at the Arena Hotel. Afternoon at leisure, our local guide will recommend unique places to visit or shopping options. (B)

#### Day 14: Istanbul

After breakfast transfer to the airport. (B)





Depart from the hotel at 9:30-10:00 am depending on the arrival time of the participants and visit Devrent Valley where various types of Fairy Chimneys are abundant. We will walk through this amazing valley. Thereafter visit Pasabagi (Monk's Valley) with multiple stems and caps, peculiar to this area. After visiting Pasabagi, drive to Avanos which is known for the pottery, a craft dating back to the Hittite period. The red clay which is worked by local craftsmen comes from the residue in the Kizilirmak river, the longest river of Turkey. Further to the time for lunch proceed to Goreme Open Air Museum to visit the churches, chapels and monasteries carved into the Fairy Chimneys from the 10th to the 13th centuries with frescopainted on the walls. Shopping time for the well-known merits of the area. Overnight in Cappadocia. (B, L, D)

**Day 8: Cappadocia-Kayseri**

After breakfast transfer to Kayseri or Nevsehir Airport for flight back to Istanbul. After arrival end of our services. (B)

## Getting Around

**By Sea from Greece:** Daily from April to October from Greece: from Samos Island to Kusadasi, from Kos Island to Bodrum and from Rhodes Island to Marmaris. There is no ferry from Athens to Istanbul or vice-versa.

Perhaps take a morning tour of the archaeological sight of Troy, home to the Trojan Horse and the legendary story of Achilles as told by Homer. Seven Churches of the Apocalypse: Mentioned by St. John in the Book of Revelations, these seven churches are all found in Turkey including Efes (Ephesus), Izmir (Smyrna), Bergama (Pergamum), Akhisar (Thyatira), Sart (Sardis), Alasehir (Philadelphia) and Eskihisar (Laodicea).

**Kusadasi:** See the ancient site of Ephesus, one of Ancient Rome's greatest cities in the Western world along with its famous Library of Celsus and the House of Virgin Mary. See the city where the Gospel of John is rumoured to have been written. It is also the location where the enormous temple of Artemis, once considered a Wonder of the Ancient World, stood.

**Pamukkale:** The spectacular hot springs in Pamukkale, also known as the White Castle due to the lime deposits are a must visit. Discover the ruins of the spa city of Hierapolis built on top of the white castle.

It is your responsibility to obtain vaccinations and preventative medicines as may be required for the duration of the trip. Any information provided by us is given in good faith.

## HEALTH & FITNESS

It is your responsibility to ensure that you have a suitable level of health and fitness to undertake the trip of your choice.

If you suffer from a medical condition which may reasonably be expected to increase your risk of needing medical attention, or which may affect the normal conduct of the trip, then you must advise us at the time you make your booking request.

We may request you to provide an assessment of your medical condition from a qualified medical practitioner. If the assessment indicates that you will require special assistance from personnel which we cannot reasonably provide, then we may cancel your booking. Provided you notified us of your medical condition at the time you made your booking request, we will provide you with a full refund of payments made. If you fail to notify us at that time or if you fail to provide a medical assessment within a reasonable time of our request, then this will be considered a cancellation by you.

We reserve the right to cancel your booking if any changed or non-disclosed medical conditions mean that you will require special assistance which we cannot reasonably provide.

We strongly suggest that your travel insurance policy includes comprehensive cancellation coverage.

## DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

We are not responsible for any additional activities or excursions which are not included in the booked itinerary or which we sell as agent for the principal operator. Any advice or recommendation made by a guide or local representative does not make us responsible.

## ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

You acknowledge that travel involves personal risks which may be greater than those present in your everyday life. This could be as a result of the adventurous nature of your trip or the visiting of destinations which present geographical, political or cultural risks and dangers.

## RESPONSIBILITY

### Services supplied by independent suppliers

### Services we directly supply

To the extent only that we are the principal supplier to you of travel arrangements or other services which we control, then we will provide those travel arrangements and services with reasonable skill and care.

We will only be responsible for our employees in the course of their employment, and for our agents and suppliers (where we are not the supplier's agent or where the supplier is not an Independent Supplier) if they were carrying out the work we had asked them to do.

We will not be responsible for any loss, damage, claim or expense caused by the acts or omissions of yourself, of any other third party not connected with the provision of the travel arrangements or services, or due to an event of Force Majeure.

While we endeavour to meet scheduled arrival and departure times, we cannot guarantee this. We will not be responsible for any loss or additional expenses you incur for any missed connections/services attributable to delays.

### General liability limitation

You acknowledge that travel arrangements or services which comply with local laws and regulations will be deemed to have been properly performed, even if this would not be considered the case in Australia.

Australian Consumer Law and corresponding legislation in State jurisdictions in certain circumstances imply mandatory conditions and warranties into consumer contracts ("Consumer Warranties"). ## COMPLAINTS

We will only consider and be responsible for claims made against us where we or our suppliers have had the opportunity to put things right on the ground. If you notify us of a problem during travel and we haven't resolved it to your satisfaction, then you must make any claim in writing within 30 days from the end of your travel arrangements.

## DEEMED ACCEPTANCE

If you place a booking on behalf of another party, you represent and warrant us that you are duly authorised to provide the agreement and consent of the other party to be bound by these Booking Conditions. You agree that you will be responsible for any loss or damage we incur if this is not the case.

## GENERAL
