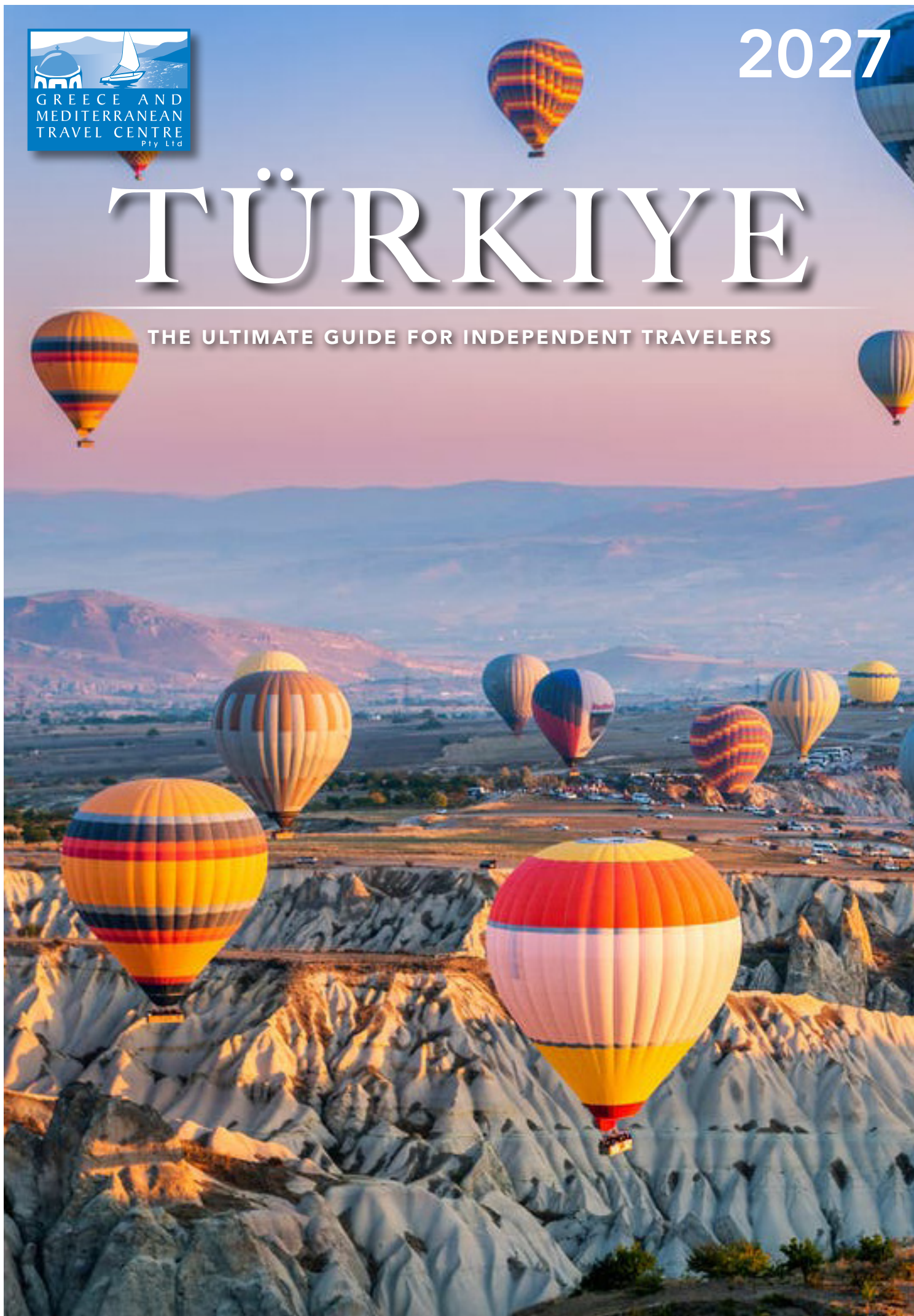

Departs: Saturdays

Day 1 Sat: Istanbul
Upon your arrival, you will be met by our representative before transfer to your hotel. Spend the rest of the day at leisure. Overnight at Hilton Double Tree Piyalepasa.

Day 2 Sun: Istanbul
After breakfast at the hotel, a guided tour of the most famous sites of Istanbul. Visit to Topkapi Palace, Blue Mosque and Spice Market. Admire the famous St. Sophia bulding which is not a mosque (from outside). The day ends with an overnight stay in Istanbul. (B)

Day 3 Mon: Istanbul-Canakkale
After breakfast at the hotel, drive to Gallipoli and visit Anzac Cove, Nek, Conk Bair, Lone Pine and 57th Regiment Memorial, cross the Dardanelles. Overnight stay in Canakkale. Overnight at Kolin Hotel. (B, D)

Day 4 Tue: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Kusadasi
After breakfast drive to legendary Troy; the site where the Trojan War took place. Cross the legendary mountain Ida and arrival at Pergamum. Visit the Acropolis and continue to Kusadasi for dinner and overnight at Elite World Kusadasi or similar hotel. (B, D)

Day 5 Wed: Kusadasi-Ephesus-Sirince-Kusadasi
After breakfast a short drive to visit Ephesus, we will have the opportunity to discover and understand the rich history behind local handicrafts like hand-made carpets and leather. Lunch at a local restaurant. Continue to the marvellous village of Sirince where you be able to experience one of the most beautiful villages in Turkey. You may be able to go shopping and taste delicious wines of the village. Return to Kusadasi for overnight stay. (B, L, D)

Day 6 Thu: Kusadasi-Hierapolis-Pamukkale
After Breakfast drive through the meandering plain and cotton farms, arrive to Pamukkale, time to enjoy the beauty of lime cascade and visit ancient Hierapolis. Dinner and overnight at Adempira in Pamukkale. (B, D)

Day 7 Fri: Pamukkale-Koycegiz-Fethiye
This morning drive to the lakeside town of Koycegiz. Here we take a boat cruise to turtle beach and smother ourselves in mud at the local mudbath. En route to Fethiye. Dinner and overnight at Marina Boutique hotel. (B, D)

Day 8 Sat: Fethiye-Kayakoy Greek village and Oludeniz-Fethiye
After breakfast explore the quaint Greek village Kayakoy. Afternoon continue to Oludeniz where you will have opportunity to swim and then drive back to your hotel. Tonight optional sunset cruise with dinner available. Overnight Fethiye. (B)

Day 9 Sun: Fethiye-Antalya
Today we will drive to Antalya. Walk in the Old Town and see Hadrian Gate and also visit Duden Waterfalls in Lara. Overnight at B.W. Khan Hotel in Antalya. (B, D)



Day 10 Mon: Antalya (Aspendos)-Konya-Cappadocia
Early departure for Konya, enroute stop by Aspendos ancient Theater. Upon arrival to Konya, we tour the monastery of the Mevlana Whirling Dervishes. Then have an afternoon drive to Cappadocia via Seljukian Caravanserai - a fine example of an ancient Silk Road. Dinner and overnight at Nino Cave Suites Cappadocia. (B, D)

Day 11 Tue: Cappadocia
Early in the morning an optional balloon tour is available. After breakfast full day excursion in Cappadocia including visits to the Kaymakli Underground City, Open Air Museum in Goreme and natural fortress in Uchisar. Lunch at a local restaurant. An optional and fun Turkish folklore evening with dinner is available tonight. Overnight in Cappadocia. (B, L)

Day 12 Wed: Cappadocia-Ankara-Safranbolu
Morning departure for Safranbolu. On the way stop by Ankara and visit Mausoleum of Atatürk and its Museum in Ankara. The burial place of the national hero who founded modern Republic of Turkey. Continue our drive and check in to our hotel in Safranbolu, the Unesco world heritage town which is considered an open air museum. Tonight we stay at an old Ottoman mansion Imren Lokum Konagi. (B, D)

Day 13 Thu: Safranbolu-Istanbul
After breakfast visit the old town of Safranbolu where you can test the fine sample of Turkish delights then continue drive to Istanbul with an afternoon visit of the Grand Bazaar. Overnight at Kent hotel in Istanbul old town. (B)

Day 14 Fri: Istanbul
Breakfast at the hotel and transfer at 9am or 13:00 to Istanbul Airport. (B)

Ankara

Jewels of Turkey

Departs: Saturdays

Note: This tour can also start on Sundays with 1 night accommodation & sightseeing in Istanbul at the end instead of the beginning of the tour.

Day 1 Sat: Istanbul

Upon arrival you will be met by our representative and transferred to your Hotel. Rest of day at your own leisure. Overnight at Double Tree By Hilton Piyalepasa or similar.

Day 2 Sun: Istanbul

Full day guided tour of most fascinating sites of Istanbul. First stop is Topkapi Palace, a setting for state occasions and royal entertainments of the Ottoman Sultans, then see the famous Hagia Sophia (from outside) as well as the Sultan Ahmet Mosque. Known to many as the Blue Mosque, this practicing mosque gains its nickname from the thousands of blue tiles which adorn the interior. Afternoon visit to Spice Bazaar. Overnight at Doubletree by Hilton Piyalepasa. (B)

Day 3 Mon: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Canakkale

Morning drive south to the Gallipoli peninsula with the Aegean Sea to the west and the Dardanelles straits to the east. Visit Anzac Cove, Nek, Chunuk Bair, and Lone Pine before crossing the Dardanelles by car ferry to Canakkale. Dinner and overnight at Kolin Hotel. (B, D)

Day 4 Tue: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Kusadasi

This morning continue south to the legendary site of Troy, now known to all as the location where the Trojan War took place. Walk the same streets where the Hero Hector once strode. After crossing Mount Ida arrive to Pergamum. Explore this ancient city perched atop a high acropolis. See the ruined temples and amphitheatre before getting back onto the coach for the drive to Kusadasi. Overnight in Kusadasi at Elite World Hotel. (B, D)

Day 5 Wed: Kusadasi-Ephesus-Sirince-Kusadasi

After breakfast visit Turkey's most famous site: Greco-Roman city of Ephesus. See the colonnaded streets, temples, tombs and even toilets. Continue on to the marvellous



village of Sirince where we will be able to do shopping and taste delicious wines. Return to Kusadasi for overnight at Elite World Hotel. (B, D)

Day 6 Thu: Kusadasi-Pamukkale

This morning drive through the lush plains and cotton farms to Pamukkale. Enjoy some free time at the lime cascades and discover the histories behind the ancient spa retreat of Hierapolis. Perhaps experience some of the delights the ancients felt while swimming in Cleopatra's pool. Dinner and overnight in Pamukkale at Adem Pira Hotel. (B, D)

Day 7 Fri: Pamukkale-Koycegiz-Fethiye

Drive to the lakeside town Koycegiz, where we take a boat cruise to Turtle Beach and enjoy some pampering at the local mudbath. Continue to Fethiye for overnight at Marina Boutique Hotel. (B, D)

Day 8 Sat: Fethiye-Kayakoy-Oludeniz-Fethiye

Visit the Greek Village of Kayakoy. Once a thriving Greek town with over 1000 houses, two churches, 14 chapels and two schools, deserted when the 25,000 Greeks were repatriated to Greece. Explore the ghost town before driving on to Oludeniz for opportunity see the famed Blue Lagoon. Enjoy swimming in the crystal clear waters or sunbathing on the golden sandy beach. Overnight at Marina Boutique Hotel. (B)

Day 9 Sun: Fethiye-Antalya

Today we will drive to Antalya. Take a walk in the Old Town featuring beautiful architecture and see the Hadrian Gate. Then also visit Duden Waterfalls in Lara. Overnight Antalya at B.W. Khan hotel. (B, D)

Day 10 Mon: Antalya-Aspendos-Konya-Cappadocia

After breakfast departure to Konya, stopping enroute at Aspendos and view its majestic theatre. Upon arrival in Konya, tour the monastery of the Mevlana and his Whirling Dervishes. Visit the museum and learn the history behind this unusual dance and religion. Afternoon drive to Cappadocia via Seljuk a fine example of an ancient Silk Road. Overnight and dinner in Cappadocia at Crowne Plaza Nevsehir. (B, D)

Day 11 Tue: Cappadocia

Full day touring the unique region of Cappadocia known for its landscapes and Fairy Chimneys. First stop is to the Kaymakli underground city. One of the largest underground settlements, the tunnels and rooms are still used today for storage, cellars and stables. Continue on to the Open Air Museum at Goreme, a reminder of

the Christians who once used the natural landscape to hide from the raiding Muslim parties. Finish the day with a visit to the natural fortress in Uchisar. Optional Turkish Folklore evening with dinner. Overnight in Cappadocia at Crowne Plaza Nevsehir. (B)

Day 12 Wed: Cappadocia-Ankara-Safranbolu

Optional morning balloon ride to enjoy watching the sun rise from the air over the fantastic scenery below. After breakfast at the hotel, depart for Safranbolu via the capital of Turkey. Upon arrival in Ankara, visit the Mausoleum of the founder of the Republic of Turkey, Ataturk. Visit the museum detailing specific events of Turkey's history. Continue on to the city named after Saffron, Safranbolu, which is still produced today, nearby. Dinner and overnight at a special category traditional hotel - Imren Lokum Konagi. (B, D)

Day 13 Thu: Safranbolu-Istanbul

Today enjoy a morning tour of the interesting UNESCO World Heritage Listed village of Safranbolu. Be sure to taste some of its famed Turkish Delight before the drive back to Istanbul. Upon arrival, enjoy an afternoon visit to the Grand Bazaar. Overnight in Istanbul at The Kent hotel in old town. (B)

Day 14 Fri: Istanbul

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer at 9am or 13:00 to Istanbul Airport. (B)

Black Sea Extension

Day 14 Fri: Istanbul-Trabzon

After breakfast transfer to Istanbul airport for flight to Trabzon. Visit Sumela Monastery nestled into the side of rocks in a famous valley in Macka. The 1000-year-old Monastery of the Virgin Mary at Sumela is among the most impressive sights of Turkey's Black Sea coast. It's 35 to 45-minute hike uphill from the parking lot to the monastery entrance. The land around the monastery is now preserved as Altindere National Park. Transfer to Novotel Hotel. (B)

Day 15 Sat: Trabzon-Istanbul

After breakfast, transfer to airport for flight back to Istanbul. Transfer to hotel. Day at leisure. (B)

Day 16 Sun: Istanbul

After breakfast transfer to the Istanbul Airport at 09:00 or 13:00. (B)

Departs: Sundays

Day 1 Sun: Istanbul

Arrive in Istanbul and transfer to your hotel. Welcome briefing in the evening. Overnight Burdock Autograph Collection hotel.

Day 2 Mon: Istanbul-Sightseeing

Enjoy a full day tour including the Hippodrome, which was once the center of life where chariot racing and other public events took place. Tour the Blue Mosque built between 1609 and 1616, famous for its blue ceramic tiles. See St. Sophia (from outside), a church built in the 6th century Byzantine capital, converted to a mosque by the Ottomans, still inhabited as a mosque in the present day and one of the world's greatest architectural wonders. Last stop will be the famous Grand Bazaar. *Optional: Dinner with belly-dancing and entertainment; Entrance ticket: Visit Topkapi Palace Museum, the opulent residence of Ottoman sultans (Harem section excluded).* (B)

Day 3 Tue: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Dardanelles-Canakkale

Depart for Gallipoli, the site of many battles during WWI. Visit Anzac Cove, Lone Pine Cemetery, and Chunuk Bair. Cross the Dardanelles Strait to Canakkale, dinner and overnight in Canakkale at Double Tree by Hilton or similar. (B, D)

Day 4 Wed: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Izmir

Visit Troy with its famous wooden horse, best known for being the setting of the Trojan War and many cities built on top of each other. Before arriving into Asklepion, enjoy lunch with locals in a traditional local village. Continue to Pergamum to visit the ancient Medical Center in Asklepion and then continue to Izmir for overnight at Kaya Thermal Hotels or similar. (B, L, D)

Day 5 Thu: Izmir-St Mary's House-Izmir

Visit the St. Mary's stone cottage where it is believed Virgin Mary spent her last years accompanied by St. John. Continue to a regional rug production center to have a firsthand experience of this unique art form. Dinner and overnight at Kaya Thermal Hotels or similar. *Optional full-day tour: Discover the spectacular ruins of Ephesus - marble streets, the Theater, Library of Celsus, Temple of Hadrian, and more.* (B, D)

Day 6 Fri: Izmir-Pamukkale

After breakfast, visit a leather fashion showroom, showcasing Turkish craftsmanship. Continue to Pamukkale, renowned for its white travertine terraces formed by thermal springs. Tour the ancient spa city of Hierapolis, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Dinner and overnight stay at Adempira Spa & Thermal Hotel or similar. (B, D)

Day 7 Sat: Pamukkale-Fethiye

Morning drive to the coastal town of Fethiye. Take a walking tour featuring Telmessos Ancient Theatre and the bustling Fish Market. Dinner and overnight stay at Alesta Yacht Hotel or similar. (B, D)

Day 8 Sun: Fethiye

Free day to relax or join optional boat cruise along the turquoise coast, with swim



stops at secluded bays and islands. Overnight at Alesta Yacht Hotel or similar. (B)

Day 9 Mon: Fethiye-Antalya

After breakfast, depart for Antalya, a resort city and gateway to Turkey's southern Mediterranean region, known as the Turquoise Coast for its blue waters. Orientation walk through the charming Old Harbor and Kaleiçi district. Dinner at a local restaurant and overnight at Mercure Antalya Konyaaltı or similar. (B, D)

Day 10 Tue: Antalya-Perge-Aspendos-Antalya

Spend a full day at leisure, or join the optional tour to Perge & Aspendos. Afternoon is free for personal activities. Overnight at Mercure Antalya Konyaaltı or similar. (B)

Day 11 Wed: Antalya-Cappadocia

Early morning departure to Cappadocia with a visit to the 13th century Caravanserai and later visit the underground city of Saratli. Dinner and overnight in Cappadocia at Hotel Gamirasu Cave or similar. (B, D)

Day 12 Thu: Cappadocia

Early Morning Optional: Hot Air Balloon Tour. Experience floating through volcanic valleys, fairy chimneys, and caves at sunrise. After breakfast, optional half-day tour: visit Goreme, a historical region of Turkey, located among the rock formations, which were first settled back in the Roman period. Many rock churches can still be observed today, as Christianity was then the prevailing religion in that region. Continue to the town of Avanos renowned for its high-quality pottery and Devrent and Red Valley. Attend a brief regional pottery workshop. Dinner at the Hotel. Join an optional Whirling Dervishes performance. Overnight at Hotel Gamirasu Cave or similar. (B, D)

Day 13 Fri: Cappadocia-Ankara

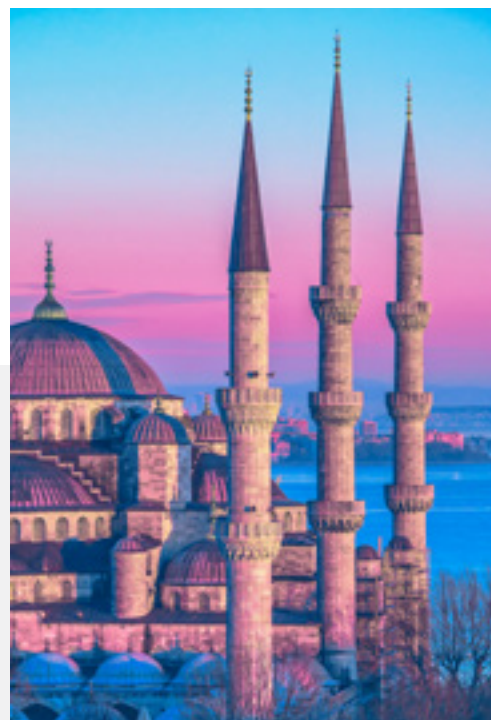

Early morning optional hot air balloon. After breakfast visit the Kaymakli Underground City, the place early Christians hid from persecutors, followed by Open Air Museum in Goreme to see the best examples of Byzantine art in Cappadocia in rock-cut churches with frescoes and paintings dated back to 10th to 13th century. Finally admire the natural fortress in Uchisar. Overnight stay at Gamirasu Cave hotel in Cappadocia. (B, D)

Day 9: Cappadocia-Ankara-Istanbul

Today the coach will drive to Istanbul, stopping via Ankara to visit the Ataturk Mausoleum. Overnight in Istanbul at the Arena Hotel. (B)

Day 1: Istanbul

Upon arrival at the airport meet a representative, who will assist with the transfer to the Arena Hotel. Located in the Old City section of Istanbul the hotel is an excellent example of a traditional 19th Century Ottoman stone house.

Day 2: Istanbul

After breakfast at your hotel enjoy a full day private guided tour of Istanbul. This Includes seeing St Sophia (from outside), the cathedral built by Emperor Justinian in 537, the Byzantine Hippodrome with its various monuments including a 3500-yearold red granite obelisk brought from Egypt in 390 AD. Day 3: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Assos

Today travel to Gallipoli where the guide will take you through the significant sites of the ANZAC. You may choose to enjoy lunch at Maydos restaurant overlooking Canakkale Harbour. Afterwards continue on to Anzac Cove, Nek, Chunuk Bair, Lone Pine and 57th Regiment Memorial. From there cross the Dardanelles, a narrow strait connecting the Aegean Sea and the Sea of Marmara. Overnight stay at Nazlihan boutique Hotel in Assos, with a magnificent location on antique seaport. (B, D)

Day 4: Assos-Troy-Pergamum-Kusadasi

Drive to legendary Troy; a 5000 year old archaeological city. See a reconstruction of the Wooden Horse, which was used in Trojan War, then cross the legendary Mount Ida to Pergamum. Visit the Acropolis of this ancient city, one of Turkey's oldest civilised settlements, which has been inhabited from prehistoric times through the Ionic, Roman and Byzantine Civilisations. This area is fascinating for history-loving tourists. It has yielded archaeological treasures whose importance is recognised worldwide. Continue to Kusadasi for overnight stay at Efe Boutique Hotel. Located on the harbour the Efe offers stunning views of the coast of Kusadasi from the modern and stylish interiors. All within walking distance of the city's centre. (B, D)

Day 5: Kusadasi-Ephesus-Kusadasi

In the morning be driven to Ancient city of Ephesus to explore some of the best preserved ancient theatres, fountains and buildings in the world. A definite must while in Turkey. After lunch climb the hill to visit the House of Mother Mary where she is thought to have spent her last years together with St. John. Return to Kusadasi for overnight stay at the Efe Boutique Hotel. Enjoy a splendid dinner at a fine restaurant overlooking Kusadasi Harbour. (B, D)

Day 6: Kusadasi-Hierapolis-Pamukkale-Marmaris

After breakfast drive through the meandering plains and cotton farms, before arriving in Pamukkale. Once here enjoy the beauty of lime cascades and visit ancient Hierapolis - which has the biggest Necropolis (with 1200 gravestones) in Turkey. The Sacred Pool is also one of the highlights of the site. There shallow thermal waters ripple over a wonderful scattering of ancient Roman ruins that lie beneath. Afterwards return to your hotel to relax in the hot spring pool. Continue on to Marmaris for overnight at the Orsmaris Boutique. Dinner at the hotel's restaurant included. (B, D)

Day 7: Marmaris-Koycegiz-Fethiye

In the morning drive to the beautiful lakeside town of Koycegiz. On arrival board a boat cruise to the beautiful Turtle Beach (Iztuzu Beach) and smoother yourself in the rejuvenating mud of the mudbaths. Afterwards transfer back to the Marina Boutique Hotel to spend the night. Just five minutes from downtown Fethiye the hotel has



a contemporary minimalist design encased in Mediterranean architecture. In the evening enjoy an authentic Turkish food at a restaurant in beautiful Fethiye. (B, D)

Day 8: Fethiye-Kayakoy-Oludeniz-Fethiye

After breakfast explore the quaint Greek village of Kayakoy. This ghost town is now preserved as a museum village, and consists of hundreds of rundown but still mostly intact Greek-style houses and churches which cover a small mountainside. In the afternoon visit Oludeniz. Take the opportunity to swim and then drive back to the Marina Boutique Hotel for overnight in Fethiye. (B, D)

Day 9: Fethiye-Saklikent Gorge-Antalya

Today visit the stunning, beautiful Saklikent Gorge, Turkey's longest and deepest canyon. After tracking along the canyon, continue to Antalya crossing the Taurus mountains. Upon arrival visit the amazing Duden Waterfall. Overnight and dinner at the Mediterra Art Hotel in Antalya. The hotel is formed by three buildings and has been renovated to reflect the Ottoman architecture including ancient fireplaces and handmade doors and wardrobes. (B, D)

Day 10: Konya-Cappadocia

Early departure for Konya. On the way stop at the Aspendos Ancient Theatre. On arrival in Konya tour the monastery of the Mevlana Whirling Dervishes. In the afternoon drive to Cappadocia via Seljuk - a fine example of an ancient Silk Road Inn. Overnight and dinner in Cappadocia at the Gamirasu Cave Hotel. Gamirasu is an exquisitely restored small troglodyte cave house. The hotel is located in a restored thousand-year-old Byzantine monastic retreat which offers modern conveniences like swimming pool and restaurant without distracting from the spiritual feeling of the area which has been known to be inhabited for more than 5000 years. Gamirasu has been featured on Channel 9's Getaway Program. (B, D)

Day 11: Cappadocia

After breakfast enjoy a full day exploring Cappadocia including visits to the Kaymakli Underground City, the place early Christians hid from persecutors, Open Air Museum in Goreme to see the best examples of Byzantine art in Cappadocia in rock-cut churches with frescoes and paintings (10th to 13th century) and natural fortress in Uchisar. Tonight have dinner at a unique cave restaurant. Overnight stay in Cappadocia. (B, D)

Day 12: Cappadocia-Ankara-Safranbolu

Very early morning optional hot air balloon tour. After breakfast depart for Safranbolu. On the way stop by Ankara to visit the Mausoleum of Ataturk and the Museum in Ankara. This is the burial place of the national hero who founded modern Republic of Turkey. Afterwards continue to Safranbolu, the UNESCO World Heritage Town considered to be an open air museum. Overnight at the Imren Lokum Konak Boutique Hotel. (B, D)

Day 13: Safranbolu-Istanbul

After breakfast visit the old town of Safranbolu where you can test the fine sample of Turkish delights then continue to drive to Istanbul to check in at the Arena Hotel. Afternoon at leisure, our local guide will recommend unique places to visit or shopping options. (B)

Morning pick up from your hotel and drive to Gallipoli and visit Anzac Cove, Lone Pine Cemetery, The Nek, 57th Regiment, chunuk bair later cross the Dardanelles, for dinner and overnight at Kolin Hotel. (B, L, D)



Day 4: Canakkale-Kusadasi

Morning visit Troy home of the "Trojan Horse" and "Helen of Troy" after lunch departure for Pergamum, tour ancient Medical center Asclepion later drive to Kusadasi and transfer to Efi Boutique Hotel. (B L D)

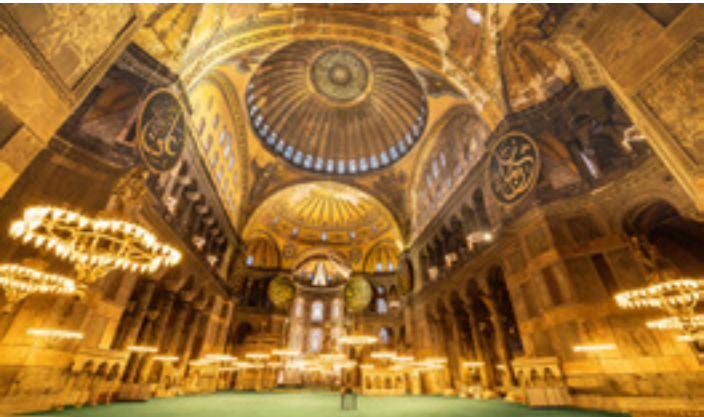

Day 7: Cappadocia

Early Morning optional Hot Air Balloon Tour. Depart from the hotel at 9:30-10:00 am depending on the arrival time of the participants and visit Devrent Valley where various types of Fairy Chimneys are abundant. We will walk through this amazing valley. Thereafter visit Pasabagi (Monk's Valley) with multiple stems and caps, peculiar to this area. After visiting Pasabagi, drive to Avanos which is known for the pottery, a craft dating back to the Hittite period. The red clay which is worked by local craftsmen comes from the residue in the Kizilirmak river, the longest river of Turkey. Further to the time for lunch proceed to Goreme Open Air Museum to visit the churches, chapels and monasteries carved into the Fairy Chimneys from the 10th to the 13th centuries with frescopainted on the walls. Shopping time for the well-known merits of the area. Overnight in Cappadocia. (B, L ,D)

Day 8: Cappadocia-Kayseri

After breakfast transfer to Kayseri or Nevsehir Airport for flight back to Istanbul. After arrival end of our services. (B)

Introduction

From the legendary ruins of Troy and the magnificent city of Ephesus to the otherworldly landscapes of Cappadocia and the dazzling white terraces of Pamukkale, Türkiye is a destination where history, culture and natural beauty come together. Explore vibrant Istanbul, the only city in the world to span two continents, or discover the nation's capital, Ankara. Soar above Cappadocia in a hot-air balloon, wander through the Göreme Open Air Museum, and relax in the ancient spa city of Hierapolis. Reflect on the ANZAC legacy at Gallipoli before experiencing Türkiye's renowned hospitality, rich cuisine and timeless traditions. A journey through Türkiye is a journey through thousands of years of civilisation.

Visas

Australian & New Zealand passport holders travelling to Türkiye for tourism or transit do not currently require a visa for stays of up to 90 days within any 180-day period. Passports should be valid for at least six months from the date of arrival. Entry requirements are subject to change, so travellers should check the latest information before departure.

Population

Türkiye has a population of approximately 88 million people, making it the 18th most populous country in the world.

Currency

The currency of Turkey is the Turkish Lira (TL).

Climate

Türkiye enjoys a diverse climate. The Mediterranean and Aegean coasts experience long, hot summers and mild, wetter winters, making them popular year-round destinations. Istanbul has a temperate climate, with average temperatures of around 5°C in January and 24°C in July. Central Anatolia has a continental climate, with hot, dry summers and cold, snowy winters. Ankara averages 0°C in January and 24°C in July. The mountainous eastern regions experience the coldest winters, with heavy snowfall, while summers are generally warm and dry.

Food

Turkish cuisine is renowned for its rich flavours, fresh ingredients and centuries of culinary tradition. Sampling the country's diverse regional dishes is an essential part of any visit. Popular favourites include succulent kebabs, freshly baked pides (Turkish-style flatbreads with a variety of toppings), meze, and delicious seafood along the Aegean and Mediterranean coasts. Türkiye operates on 220–240 volts (50Hz). Power outlets use the European two-pin round plug. Travellers from Australia and New Zealand need a suitable plug adapter.

Getting Around

Keep in mind that distances between destinations can be considerable, traffic is often heavy in major cities, and parking can be difficult to find in busy urban areas.

Shopping

By Air: Türkiye is well connected to Australia via one-stop flights operated by airlines including Emirates, Qatar Airways, Etihad Airways, Singapore Airlines and Turkish Airlines. Most services connect through major hubs in the Middle East or Asia, with additional connections available via selected European cities.

By Sea from Greece: Seasonal ferry services (generally operating from April to October) connect several Greek islands with the Turkish coast, including Samos–Kuşadası, Kos–Bodrum and Rhodes–Marmaris. There is no direct passenger ferry between Athens and Istanbul.

Türkiye offers accommodation to suit every taste and budget, from luxurious former Ottoman palaces and stylish boutique hotels to charming heritage properties and comfortable budget hotels. Things to Do

These changes may affect prices, duration of tours, itineraries, contents, etc. Information contained in the brochure has been carefully checked and to the best of our knowledge is correct at the time of publishing. Prices and conditions of travel are subject to change without notice.

BOOKINGS

Contact your Travel Agent or Greece and Mediterranean Travel Centre Pty Ltd to make your reservations.

A booking request is accepted when we issue a written booking confirmation and you have paid your deposit. It is at this point that a contract between us and you comes into existence subject to these Booking Conditions. We reserve the right to decline any booking at our discretion. No employee of ours other than a director has the authority to vary or omit any of these Booking Conditions or to promise any discount, refund or credit.

Confirmed bookings will be issued with an invoice upon confirmation detailing all services booked. It is your responsibility to ensure all details are correct. The right is reserved to correct any clear and obvious errors in rates quoted or calculated for any service notwithstanding that the invoice may have been paid in full.

You must check your booking confirmation carefully and notify us of any errors as soon as possible. If we made the error and you notify us as soon as possible, we will be responsible for any supplier-imposed charges to correct the error. In other cases, you will be responsible for these charges.

SERVICES

We commence providing services to you as soon as we accept your booking. DEPOSIT

CANCELLATIONS BY YOU

General Cancellations

If you wish to cancel your trip for other reasons than as set out below, we require written notice and will make refunds to you less cancellation fees in accordance with the table below, calculated from the date which we receive written notice:

Ferry Tickets: All ferry tickets are not refundable once paid in full regardless of date of cancellation.

Other Services:

- Over 45 days before commencement: Deposit and any instalment payments only
- 45 days to 31 days before commencement: 50% of the booking value
- Within 30 days or no show 100% of the booking value. Certain products might be subject to additional cancellation fees in excess of the above. This will be advised at the time your reservation is confirmed.

General

You agree that the deductions and cancellation charges specified above are reasonable, represent a genuine pre-estimate of our loss and are required to protect our legitimate business interests.

OTHER CANCELLATIONS

Force Majeure – Prior to travel

If:

- in our reasonable opinion we (either directly or through our employees, contractors, suppliers or agents) determine that your travel arrangements cannot safely, lawfully or reasonably proceed due to a Force Majeure event; or
- you give us notice no more than 14 days prior to commencement of your booked travel arrangements that you cannot reasonably make use of them due to Government Restrictions (for example due to border closures)

then we may:

- reschedule your travel arrangements, but only if you are agreeable to the rescheduled arrangements; or
- cancel affected travel arrangements, in which case our contract with you for the affected arrangements will terminate.

If we cancel affected travel arrangements, neither of us will have any claim for damages against the other for them. However, we will either:

- issue you with a credit equal to payments received by us for the cancelled travel arrangements, redeemable within 24 months of issue against any travel services offered by us; or
- refund payments attributable to the cancelled travel arrangements less: (a) unrecoverable third party costs and other expenses incurred or payable by us for the cancelled travel arrangements; (b) overhead charges incurred by us relative to the price of the cancelled travel arrangements; and (c) fair compensation for work undertaken by us in relation to the cancelled travel arrangements until the time of cancellation and in connection with the processing of any refund.

Please note that our ability to issue you with a credit may be dependent on our suppliers issuing corresponding credits to us. We cannot guarantee that our suppliers will issue corresponding credits and so in such circumstances we may opt to pay you a limited cash refund as outlined.

Force Majeure – During travel

If due to Force Majeure we cancel travel arrangements after your trip has commenced, we will provide you with a refund of recovered third party costs plus any third party costs we don't incur for cancelled travel arrangements only.

Force Majeure – General

Where a limited cash refund is to be paid by us, we will use reasonable endeavours to recover payments from third parties attributable to your booking, but we make no guarantee that we will be able to recover these payments either partially or at all. If after we have paid you a limited cash refund (or after we determine that no cash refund is currently payable) we recover payments from third parties attributable to your booking, then we will pass on this payment to you.

We will not be responsible for any other loss or costs you incur in connection with your booking (for example, airfares, insurance and visa expenses) if your trip or particular travel arrangements are cancelled due to an event of Force Majeure.

AMENDMENTS BY YOU

AMENDMENTS BY US

Prior to travel

If we become aware of any significant changes to your itinerary or its inclusions that materially detract from the overall value of the trip (where we determine it can still proceed), then we will notify you within a reasonable time and refund you an amount attributable to any reduction in value determined by us acting reasonably.

Accommodation

Due to the dynamic nature of travel, we may need to substitute hotels, vessels and other forms of accommodation with properties or vessels of a substantially comparable or higher standard. We will endeavour to minimise substitutions. You acknowledge that these substitutions will not be considered a significant change.

Booking Conditions (continued)

Alternative flights due to safety or security concerns

If flights are included in your travel arrangements and a scheduled flight is cancelled, suspended or materially changed due to war, armed conflict, civil strife, terrorist activity or the threat of such acts, or if we reasonably determine that the intended carrier, route or transit point cannot safely or reasonably be used, we may arrange replacement flights with an alternative carrier or on an alternative route. We will notify you of any additional costs as soon as reasonably practicable and use reasonable endeavours to minimise them. During travel

General

To the fullest extent permitted by law:

- we will not be responsible for any omissions or modifications to the itinerary or the inclusions due to Force Majeure or other circumstances beyond our control happening after we have accepted your booking. This includes any loss of enjoyment or distress caused by omissions or modifications;

Services we directly supply

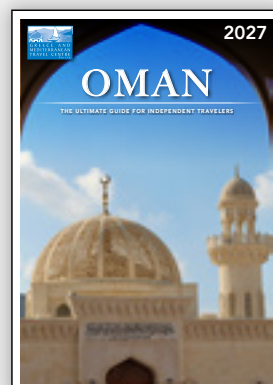
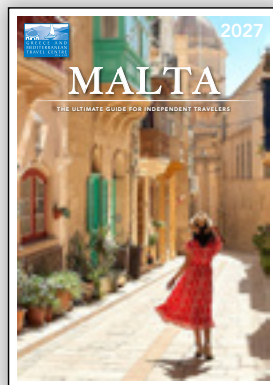
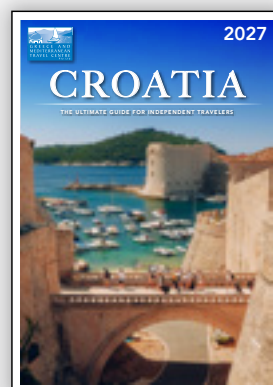
